ATTENTION ALL 4-H'ERS & PARENTS - ADD/DROP INFORMATION

There are several responsibilities as a 4-H'er and a 4-H parent. One of these responsibilities is the Adding and Dropping of 4-H Projects. It is <u>YOUR</u> responsibility to add or drop any projects by May 1. You will need to do this by going to https://ks.4honline.com and log into your account. After May 1, the system will not allow you to add or drop projects. Remember, 4-H members must be enrolled in the project area(s) they will be exhibiting at the county fair. If you have any questions, do not

hesitate to contact either Extension Office.

SEWING MACHINES FOR CHECKOUT FOR 4-H MEMBERS ONLY

The District has three sewing machines for 4-H members to check out (one in Minneapolis and two in Salina). The machines can be checked out for 7 days, or 1 week. Checkout will require a \$100 refundable deposit, with checks to be made out to CKD Extension. If the 4-H member wants to check out the ½ inch foot, that will require an additional \$30 deposit. Individuals MUST allow for time to go through a check out sheet and check in sheet when checking out and returning the sewing machine. Note: The only sewing needles provided are the 80/12 needles. If the 4-H member needs a special needle based on the material he/she will be working with, he/she will need to supply their own.

Beef Check-in will be **Saturday, March 11**. From 8:30 -11 a.m. we will be at Glenn Engelland's Farm. We will also be checking-in from 1-3 p.m. at Spencer Schrader's. Regardless of where you plan to go, please call 309-5850 for a time by **Thursday, March 9**. Both check-ins are open to all District 4-H Members. At both sites we will be weighing, tagging market animals and tagging and tattoo Commercial Heifers, if needed. When you call for a time, be sure to let the office know if you would like your animals nominated to show at the Kansas State Fair and/or the Junior Livestock Show (cost is to be determined). All animals will have an official "Kansas 4-H" ear tag put in the ear at a cost of \$3/tag. For more details and directions to the weigh-in locations, see the February 4-H Newsletter.

This "Blow and Go" show will be held on Saturday, April 8th, 2017. The show is open to any bonafide 4-H and FFA members who have not yet reached their 19th birthday before January 1, 2017. There will be a special class for the 4-H'ers enrolled in a club in the Central Kansas District. The entry fee is \$15 per head, but after March 24th the fee will increase to \$20 per head. DISCOVERY DAYS: MAY 30 – JUNE 2, 2017

Discovery Days registration "Make a Splash" opens March 1! You can find the online registration at www.kansas4-H.org when you click on "4-H Event Registration." The deadline to register is 11:59 p.m. on April 20, 2017. Registration fees (checks made payable to CKD 4-H Council), scholarship application, and a copy of the registration confirmation are due no later than April 20, 5:00 p.m. to either Extension Office. In order to qualify for a scholarship through 4-H Council, individuals must complete the 4-H Council Scholarship Application and submit it at the same time as they pay their

registration fees. The cost of Discovery Days is \$230 plus any additional class fees for non-4-H members. The cost for 4-H members is \$155 with an approved 4-H Council Scholarship Application, plus any additional class fees. If CKD determines that a bus is needed for transportation (depending on the number of participants), a \$10 fee will be due before Discovery Days. Registrations that are cancelled on or before April 15 will be charged a \$25 cancellation fee. The 4-H Council Scholarship WILL NOT cover this cancellation fee. Any cancellations made after May 1 will be charged the full amount.

For 2017 – If you would like to be housed in a suite (2-4 people sharing a bathroom), you can upgrade your registration for \$35/person. Space is very limited and will be on a first come, first serve basis. Any and all requests for housing should be submitted when the delegate registers for Discovery Days.

ATTENTION 4-H FAMILIES & ORGANIZATIONAL LEADERS: CENTRAL KANSAS DISTRICT POLICY

The Central Kansas Extension Board adopted a policy to go alongside the Kansas 4-H Policy regarding fundraising at the February 2014 Board Meeting. The policy is:

"4-H members MAY NOT solicit funds to help fund their individual 4-H projects. 4-H members may fundraise for a specific 4-H EDUCATIONAL trip. Donations given directly to a 4-H member ARE NOT tax deductible because they do not go to a 4-H club or group. Any fundraising programs by clubs or individuals MUST be approved by the 4-H Youth Development Agent; the funds must be used to further the 4-H mission; the account procedures must be appropriate and in accordance with the POLICY; and the 4-H name and emblem must be properly used."

Any fundraising done in the name of 4-H needs to be approved by Sarah.

WANTED: CAMP COUNSELORS & JUNIOR CAMP COUNSELORS

If you are currently an 8th grader or older...we need YOU! Camp Counselors are 8th through 12th graders (preference given to older youth). Camp will be June 10-13. Counselor applications are available at either Extension Office and online. Applications will be due April 13. All counselor applicants <u>must</u> attend the Counselor Training on June 9 and 10 at Rock Springs. Interviews will be scheduled in Minneapolis on April 24 and in Salina on April 17 and April 25. Interviews will be scheduled between 3:00 -5:30 p.m. If these dates and times don't work for you, contact Sarah (semaass@k-state.edu) to set up an appointment for an interview. Camp Counselors will need to complete the 4-H Council Scholarship Application and meet the necessary requirements to be eligible for the 4-H Council Scholarship. The scholarship application is due with the Camp Counselor Application. If the scholarship application is approved, the counselors will not have to pay their registration fee. Please make sure you also begin the Volunteer Screening Process if you have not, or update for 2017 with a renewal.



4-H CAMP

Four action-packed days await 4-H'ers ready for exploring Rock Springs 4-H Center, June 10-13! Meet new and old friends to enjoy swimming, canoeing and horseback riding when you sign up for 4-H camp.

Who can go? 4-H members and their friends who have or will be completing grades 3-7 may attend.

The cost for a regular camper is \$222 or \$122 with the scholarship.

BUS FOR 4-H CAMP

4-H Members will ride the bus for free. Non 4-H members will be charged a \$5 fee.

4-H ROOKIE CAMP

Come one come all 1st and 2nd graders for an overnight camp. Enjoy swimming, horseback riding and more. This is based on a first come, first served basis, so register early to secure your spot!

This year there will be two sessions for Rookie Camp. The first group will be June 10-11. The second group will be June 12-13. When you register online for camp, you will be asked if there is a session that WILL NOT work for your child(ren). All efforts will be made to accommodate the request above, but there will be no session preference guarantee. After the registration deadline, you will receive notification for which session your child(ren) has been placed.

The cost for a rookie camper will be \$107 or \$37 with the scholarship.

At the time of writing this newsletter, online registration was not ready. As soon as the online registration opens, an email will be sent through 4HOnline to eligible 4-H members.

ATTENTION ALL 4-H MEMBERS ATTENDING CAMP – SCHOLARSHIP INFORMATION

Campers will need to complete the 4-H Council Scholarship Application and meet the necessary requirements to be eligible for the 4-H Council Scholarship. The scholarship application will include a paragraph on "Why I want to attend camp." Scholarship sponsors include: 4-H Council, Ottawa County 4-H Foundation, Salina Downtown Lions and Saline County 4-H Development Fund. **The completed scholarship application will be due by the camp registration deadline (remember, it requires an organizational leader signature and the 4-H'er signature).** Don't miss out on this fun adventure!

Qualified for a Red Wheel Scholarship? If a 4-H member qualified for a red wheel scholarship, he/she can use this for 4-H Camp! The 4-H member will need to register online. Once he/she has registered, he/she will need to contact Dorothy (dbray@ksu.edu or 309-5850) at the Salina Extension Office to let her know that he/she has registered for camp. Once the registration has been confirmed, a check will be sent to the 4-H member/family. Please allow 7-10 business days for this to occur.

Remember...all campers will ride the bus. Full-time campers will ride it to and from. First session rookie campers will ride it to camp and someone will need to pick them up. Second session rookie campers will need their own transportation to camp, and then they will ride the bus home.

If your child(ren) have meds, they will need to be checked in with the Ambassadors at the time of loading the bus.

It will then be given to the nurses when the buses get to camp.
