KANSAS 4-H PROGRAMMING FEE AND ENROLLMENT NEWS

- Who pays the \$15 Kansas 4-H Programming Fee? Organized community club members and independent 4-H members, ages 7-18. Cloverbuds do not have to pay the fee. There is no family cap.
- The fee will be collected beginning when enrollment opens at 8 a.m. on Monday, October 2, 2017.
- Members may apply for a waiver to pay the program fee when they enroll.
- Payment options include: debit/credit card; check; sponsor; waiver.
- The Program Fee is NOT tax deductible since it is paying for specific individuals.
- The Central Kansas District has not secured a sponsor to pay for Kansas 4-H Programming Fee at this time. Therefore families will be responsible for paying the fee.
- All club members should pay by check, debit/credit card, or request a waiver. Members should ONLY select sponsor if their club leaders have informed them to do so.

CENTRAL KANSAS DISTRICT 4-H COUNCIL OFFICER APPLICATIONS

Have you considered taking a leadership role with the Central Kansas District 4-H Council? Well, now is your chance! 4-H Council Officer Applications are available on the website (http://www.centralkansas.ksu.edu/4-H) under 4-H'er Forms & Documents. Applications are due to either Extension Office by 5 p.m. on Friday, September 1. One year of 4-H Council experience is required. NATIONAL 4-H CONFERENCE

The National 4-H Conference is a working conference where youth and adults, at the invitation of the Secretary of Agriculture, assist in the development of recommendations to help guide 4-H Youth Development Programs nationally and in their communities. This event brings together youth, volunteer leaders, and state and county Extension staff members from across the United States, the U.S. Territories, and the Canadian Provinces.



Delegates must be 15 to 18 years old before January 1, 2018. Up to six Kansas youth may be selected as delegates. Kansas 4-H members who have attended National 4-H Congress are eligible to apply for National 4-H Conference. The 2018 National 4-H Conference will be held April 7-12, 2018, at the National 4-H Center in Chevy Chase, Maryland. Applications and letters of reference will be due to the State 4-H Office in Manhattan no later than 5 p.m. on October 2, 2017. Applications are now available online. KANSAS YOUTH LEADERSHIP FORUM (KYLF)

The Kansas Youth Leadership Forum will be held November 17-19, 2017, at Rock Springs 4-H Center. The Forum is for youth ages 14-18, as of January 1, 2018. Details have not yet been posted, but will be soon and found at http://www.kansas4-h.org. Registration will be online and youth will select their workshops at this time. The early registration deadline is October 16.

To be eligible for a scholarship through District 4-H Council, do not forget to complete the 4-H Council Scholarship Application (http://www.centralkansas.ksu.edu/4-h, under 4-H'er Forms and

Documents) and turn in to the Extension Office by the registration deadline. The scholarship will be \$75. There will be a \$25 cancellation fee that will be charged to any 4-H member who decides not to attend after registering. This is not a local fee, but a state fee. The 4-H Council Scholarship WILL NOT cover this cancellation fee.

KANSAS 4-H YOUTH LEADERSHIP COUNCIL

Any Kansas 4-H member between the ages of 14 and 18 before January 1, 2018, may apply to be a state council member. The duties of the state council members include planning the next Youth Leadership Forum, Campference, Citizenship In Action, 48 Hours of 4-H, and may include assisting with State 4-H functions, working with 4-H public relations, and speaking at local achievement programs, forums, and other workshops or conferences. Applications for the State 4-H Youth Council are now available on the State 4-H website (http://www.kansas4-h.org, under Events and Activities, General State Events/Conferences and Events, Kansas Youth Leadership Forum) and will be due October 2, 5 p.m. online. DON'T FORGET - RECORDS COMPLETE YOUR 4-H YEAR

To qualify for a completed 4-H year, members have options for their documentation:

- 1. Complete a KAP for each project.
- 2. Complete a KAP for those projects applying for award program and the Central Kansas District 4-H Project Record Form(s) for remaining projects.
- 3. Complete Central Kansas District 4-H Project Record Form(s) for all projects (this form new in 2015).

By completing the permanent record (not required to be included with the KAP) throughout the 4-H year, it helps to complete the forms above.

KANSAS 4-H VOLUNTEER FORUM

Kansas 4-H Volunteer Forum will be held November 17-19, 2017, Rock Springs 4-H Center. The Kansas Volunteer Forum continues to be a part of the Kansas 4-H Leadership Weekend. The Kansas Association of 4-H Volunteers (KA4-HV) is hard at work planning an outstanding Volunteer Forum for all Kansas 4-H Volunteers. The Kansas Volunteer Forum will include workshops, a program from the Kansas Leadership Center, and lots of opportunities to network and share resources.

Registration information was not available at the time this newsletter was written. Please check http://www.kansas4-h.org often for details. The online registration deadline is October 16. There will be a \$25 cancellation fee that will be charged to any volunteer who decides not to attend after November 1. This is not a local fee, but a state fee. 4-H Council has a limited number of \$50 scholarships provided for the adult volunteers to help offset the cost of the registration cost. This scholarship will not pay for the \$25 cancellation fee.

KANSAS STATE FAIR – SEPTEMBER 8-17

Eligibility and Transportation of Exhibits

If you received a purple ribbon on your project at the county level, are 9 years old or older (before January 1, 2017), and if your class is offered at the state level, you have met the requirements for being a state fair exhibitor! If you have small exhibits (and they are not alive!), they will be taken to Hutchinson for you.

<u>State fair exhibits cannot be brought into the Extension offices until September 5, 6, and 7 during office hours</u>. You will need to plan on extra time when you come to the office because you will need to attach the necessary items to the exhibit (i.e., entry card, score sheet, food label, etc.). **You** will be responsible for attaching the items, <u>not the office staff</u>. Office staff will be available to help if you have questions. Entry cards and other necessary items for the exhibits **will not** be allowed to leave the Extension Office unless you are taking your own exhibits down to the state fair.

Note: Rabbit, Dog, and Dairy entry cards will be available at the state fair. Please read the State Fair Guidelines 2017 posted on the website under 4-H Youth Development, County Fairs, Kansas State Fair Guidelines on how to prepare your exhibits and bring them to the Salina office ready to go to Hutchinson.

All 4-H'ers - As you prepare to bring items to the office, please note the following:

- You will come to the office and we will have your entry cards and stickers, if needed, for your exhibit.
- Once you have prepared the exhibit with the entry cards, etc., be sure and bring the necessary packing stuff with you.
- Please package your exhibits for travel as the Extension Offices cannot be responsible for breakage.
- Please check-in with office staff after you have finished preparing and packing the item(s) for the state fair.

All 4-H'ers must have their non-perishable items, such as woodworking, photography, geology, entomology, etc., to their respective offices by 5 p.m. on Thursday, September 7. All exhibits (includes foods) for Salina area 4-H'ers may be brought to the Salina office on September 5, 6, 7 during office hours, 8 a.m. – 5 p.m. Minneapolis area 4-H'ers food exhibits must be at the Minneapolis office before 8 a.m. on Friday, September 8 (building opens at 7:15 a.m.).

All exhibits will return from the fair on September 17, and <u>Salina area</u> exhibits may be picked up beginning at noon on September 18. <u>Minneapolis area</u> exhibits may be picked up beginning at 9 a.m. on September 20. For more information, please contact your respective local Extension Office.



2017 DISTRICT 4-H AWARDS & RECOGNITION INFORMATION

It's hard to imagine that the end of another 4-H year is upon us. With the end of the 4-H year comes time to finish filling out the pin applications, record books, Kansas Award Portfolio's, etc. This document highlights the Central Kansas District 4-H Awards System and what awards and recognition are available to 4-H members. 4-H'ers and Parents are strongly encouraged to read this document thoroughly. Note: Events occurring after the due date for District awards will count towards the next 4-H year.



Pin Applications/Member Achievement Plan (Revised 09/16)

Top off the 2016-17 year in style...apply for the Achievement Pins! How, you may ask? The Achievement Pin Application is available on the District website (http://www.centralkansas.ksu.edu/4-h). The 4-H Member Achievement Plan is found under 4-H Youth Development → Awards & Recognition → Member Achievement Plan. Regardless of what pin the 4-H member is applying for, they will all fill out the same form, but the items required will vary (see the details on the first page).

The Achievement Pins or Standard of Excellence Award Categories: Where a "standard" is set and completion of categories is determined by a minimum requirement.

- 1. Membership Pin
- 2. Bronze Pin
- 3. Clover Pin
- 4. Emerald Pin
- 5. Silver Pin
- 6. Silver Guard

- 7. Leadership Pin
 Must be enrolled in:
 Citizenship & Leadership
- 8. Gold Pin
- 9. Gold Guard
- 10. Citizenship Pin

Please note:

- Only one Achievement Pin can be received by each 4-H member per year.
- A pin may be skipped, but once a pin is skipped, a 4-H'er may not go back and apply for it. For example: If a 4-H'er received the Emerald Pin in 2013, receives the Silver Guard in 2014, he/she cannot apply for the Silver Pin in 2015.
- Only Central Kansas District 4-H Member Achievement Plan Applications will be accepted. Be sure to download the application from the District website.

Appeal Process for Deferred Pin Applications/Member Achievement Plans (2017)

If a 4-H member has his/her pin application deferred on the club level, the organizational leader is to notify the 4-H member. If the 4-H member wishes to appeal the deferral, they may do so by completing the Appeal Process form. The Appeal Process form is found under 4-H Youth Development \rightarrow Awards & Recognition \rightarrow Member Achievement Plan.

Kansas 4-H Key Award (November 2012)

The Kansas 4-H Key Award is a state award. The basic requirements are: 1) a 4-H'er must have passed his/her 16th birthday before January 1 of the current year; 2) completed four or more years of 4-H work; and 3) enrolled in leadership for four or more years. There are several other requirements for this award. The Kansas 4-H Key Award is found under 4-H Youth Development → Awards & Recognition → Key Award Application (found under Additional Award Forms). While this award application is due on September 25, 5 p.m., there is an optional "review deadline" of August 28, 5 p.m. If a 4-H member submits their Key Award Application by August 28, the Trips & Awards Committee will review it and provide them feedback on what they will need to change in order for the 4-H member to receive the Kansas 4-H Key Award. If a 4-H member does not turn an application in until September 25, 5 p.m., and the application is not thorough, the 4-H member will not receive an opportunity to revise the application. They will have to apply for the award the following year, if eligible.

<u>Please note</u>: A 4-H member may apply for the Kansas 4-H Key Award (State Award) in addition to an Achievement Pin (District Award) in the same year.

Ten-Year Award (2017)

In order for a 4-H member to receive a plaque for being in 4-H for 10 years, he/she will need to complete the Ten-Year Award Application. The Ten-Year Award Application is found under 4-H Youth Development \rightarrow Awards & Recognition \rightarrow Ten-Year Award Application (found under Additional Award Forms). This application will be due September 25, 5 p.m.

Outstanding 4-H'er Award

Do you want to be considered for the Outstanding 4-H'er Award? Are you wondering what you need to do to be considered? If you are a 4-H member 15 years old and older before January 1 of the current year, and want to apply for this award, the first thing to do is to complete and turn in a Kansas Award Portfolio (KAP) *in any 4-H project award area* by September 25. *After all the books are judged, the members with the top scoring books will be interviewed by a panel on Sunday, October 15, in the afternoon*. Interviewees will be notified by email with their scheduled time and location of the interview.

The Outstanding 4-H'er(s) will be named at the *Central Kansas District 4-H Celebration of Achievements*. If you are selected to interview, you will want to dress in business professional attire. This means, guys, you will want to wear dress pants, button up shirt and tie, no tennis or athletic shoes. A suit jacket is optional, but you may want to try to borrow one if you don't have one. Girls, a dress, skirt, or dress slacks and top is appropriate...no spaghetti straps.

Remember your appearance is someone's first impression of you and will set the tone of your interview. You should also prepare by reviewing your KAP...you will probably be asked some questions about your leadership roles and other things you accomplished this year so make sure you have a copy of your KAP because your KAP will not be returned until the *Central Kansas District 4-H Celebration of Achievements*.

This award may only be received once during a member's 4-H career.

Kansas Award Portfolio (KAP)

Did you know that the true completion of your 4-H project is the final report you write...a.k.a. your Record Book or the Kansas Award Portfolio (KAP)? The number one question asked about KAP's is "who can apply?" The answer is any 4-H member. All 4-H'ers will submit their KAPs to their club leaders and the leaders will turn all of the KAPs in to either Extension Office. So, if your goal is to receive a District Award in a 4-H Project Area, then you will want to fill out the KAP. KAP Project Awards can be received more than once during a 4-H member's career. Below are the 4-H Project Award Areas.

There are three age levels for the 4-H Project Awards. They are 7-8 year olds, 9-12 year olds, and 13 years old and older. All KAP Forms are available on the District website under 4-H Youth Development \rightarrow Awards & Recognition \rightarrow Kansas Award Portfolio (KAP) Documents. The awards will be divided by age groups: 7-8 years old; 9-12 years old; and 13 years old and older. Guidelines for the different age groups are:

7-8 years old (Updated 09/13/2011)

This age group will fill out the KAP for the 7-8 year olds. Instead of a 6 page typed (or handwritten) story AND 3 pages of pictures, the 4-H'er will be given 4 total pages to provide pictures and a story. In order for the 4-H'er to tell their 4-H story and share pictures of their projects, they will be allowed to draw, use stickers, color, use photographs, clipart, and handwrite or type their story. The main guideline is that they stay within the 4 page requirement. This age group will need to turn in their award application in a red or blue notebook. Everyone in the 7-8 year old group that has turned in a KAP will all receive a participation certificate and a "token" of recognition (i.e., 4-H item such as a pencil, key chain, magnet, etc.).

9-12 years old (Updated 07/22/2009)

This group will need to use the KAP for the 9-13 year olds (<u>We use the state form and it will state it is for 9-13 year olds</u>, <u>but for the Central Kansas District it will be only for 9-12 year olds</u>). The guidelines on the KAP will need to be followed. This age group will need to turn in their award application in a white notebook.

13 years old and older (Revised 09/15/2014)

This group will need to fill out the KAP for the 14 years old and older (<u>We use the state form and it will state it is for 14 years old and older, but for the Central Kansas District it will be for those 13 years old and older</u>). They will need to follow the guidelines on the KAP as set forth by the State 4-H Office for the area and state contests. This age group will need to turn in their award application in a black notebook.

The 9-12 year old group & 13 years old and older group will be recognized using the following guideline: Youth will be recognized based on the enrollment in the age group. 10% or up to 4 books/individuals may be recognized. But, if 15 or more books are turned in a project area more youth may be recognized. For every 5 books over 10, one more 4-H'er may receive recognition. For example, if the photography project had 23 award recognition books turned in and had an enrollment of 43, 6 books/individuals may be recognized (10% up to 4 and for every additional 5 books after 10, 1 more youth can be recognized...4+1+1 = 6). Only books in the 9-13 year old and 14 year old and older groups that warrant recognition will be recognized for an award.

The notebooks should be ½ inch or 1 inch 3-ring binder. No clipart or pictures are allowed on the cover page. The notebooks should have a label (or sheet of paper for the presentation/view binder notebooks) with the following:

4-H'ers name (First and Last name)
Central Kansas District
4-H Club Name
4-H Project Area

Additional Club Forms

For the 4-H member who just wants to keep records and not compete for a 4-H Project Award, they will need to complete the Central Kansas District 4-H Project Record (Revised 2005) for them. This form will replace the Generic 4-H Project Record Form. The Central Kansas District 4-H Project Record will NOT be used for a District Project Award, only for the 4-H'ers who just want to fill out a record book on their project. This form would count towards the record book requirement for the achievement pin applications. The Central Kansas District 4-H Project Record is found under 4-H Youth Development \rightarrow Awards & Recognition \rightarrow Central Kansas District 4-H Project Record (found under Record Keeping Materials) OR under 4-H Youth Development \rightarrow Record Keeping Materials \rightarrow Central Kansas District 4-H Project Record.

In addition to the Central Kansas District 4-H Project Record, the $\underline{\text{4-H Permanent Record}}$ (10/01/2008) is also a great record keeping tool for 4-H members. The Permanent Record is found under 4-H Youth Development \rightarrow Awards & Recognition \rightarrow Permanent Record (found under Record Keeping Materials) OR under 4-H Youth Development \rightarrow Record Keeping Materials \rightarrow Permanent Record.

Most clubs use the <u>CKD Record Book Check Sheet</u> (Revised 09/2016) to help review the 4-H Record Books and KAP's before they come to the Extension Office. The CKD Record Book Check Sheet is found under 4-H Youth Development → Awards & Recognition → CKD Record Book Check Sheet (found under Record Keeping Materials) OR under 4-H Youth Development → Record Keeping Materials → CKD Record Book Check Sheet.

<u>A complete 4-H Record Book</u> includes: the Central Kansas District 4-H Project Record Form for each project enrolled in (that a KAP is not completed), 4-H Personal Page, Permanent Record, 4-H Story, and Pictures.

Also, organizational leaders, the <u>Club Summary</u> (or annual summary) (Revised 09/2016) for the club seal is available under 4-H Youth Development \rightarrow Organizational Leaders \rightarrow Club Summary. This form is due September 25, 5 p.m., to either Extension Office.

Don't forget that the Club Secretary's Book is also due to the Extension Office on September 25.

Each 4-H Community Club or Individual can nominate an individual(s) for this award. The nomination should be typed and the requirements are as follows:

- Submit a name of someone whom you feel has contributed a great deal to Central Kansas District 4-H
- # The nominee does not have to serve in a volunteer leader role
- The nominee should be a past 4-H member, but does not have to have been a 4-H member in the Central Kansas District (Ottawa or Saline County)
- While a nomination form can be found under 4-H Youth Development → Organizational Leaders → 2016-17 Leader Forms, nominations can be made in a letter form to the review committee and contain the criteria mentioned above.

Family of the Year – Due September 25, 5 p.m.

Each 4-H Community Club or Individual can nominate several families for this award (one nomination form per family). The nomination should be typed and the requirements are as follows:

- To be eligible, at least one member of the family must be a current Central Kansas District 4-H'er or 4-H volunteer leader
- ****** The selection criteria for this award includes:
 - Balance of total family involvement in 4-H
 - Contributions family has made to the 4-H program (most weight given to club and local levels)
 - Years of service to 4-H
 - Involvement and contributions given to community
 - Evidence family has benefited from 4-H
- While a nomination form can be found under 4-H Youth Development → Organizational Leaders → 2016-17 Leader Forms, nominations can be made in a letter form to the review committee and contain the criteria mentioned above.

Friend of 4-H – Due September 25, 5 p.m.

Each 4-H Community Club can nominate a maximum of one individual for this award. The nomination should be typed and the requirements are as follows:

- Submit a name of someone whom you feel has contributed a great deal to Central Kansas District 4-H
- # The nominee does not have to serve in a volunteer leader role
- # The nominee does not have to be a past 4-H member
- **While a nomination form can be found under 4-H Youth Development** → Organizational Leaders → 2016-17 Leader Forms, nominations can be made in a letter form to the review committee and contain the criteria mentioned above.

Volunteer of the Year Award

This award is for individuals who have served as 4-H volunteers for less than 10 years at the district or state level as determined before January 1 of the current year. Nominations can come from the club or individuals. Self-nominations are accepted and encouraged. One award will be given each year. Nominations may be made in a letter form indicating why the nominee is deserving of this award. This nomination will be due September 25, 5 p.m., to either Extension Office.

Outstanding Lifetime Volunteer Award

This award is for individuals who have served 10 or more years at the district or state level as determined before January 1 of the current year. Nominations can come from the club or individuals. Self-nominations are accepted and encouraged. One award will be given each year. Nominations may be made in a letter form indicating why the nominee is deserving of this award. This nomination will be due September 25, 5 p.m., to either Extension Office.

At the time of updating the award information, we had not received details from the state regarding the 4-H alumni, volunteer of the year, and outstanding lifetime volunteer awards. Therefore we do not know if there will be state awards in these areas for 2018.
