#### FAIR PAPER, 4-H DIVISIONS

The Fair Paper is currently on the Central Kansas District website <u>http://www.centralkansas.ksu.edu/4-h</u> under County Fairs, Tri-Rivers Fair. We strongly encourage 4-H members and parents to check the Fair Paper periodically because when typos are found, we update the Fair Paper. Be sure to check the Fair Paper for the last date it was updated, as the date it was updated will be located on each page in the upper right-hand corner. We will compile a list of changes and post to our website at <u>https://www.centralkansas.k-state.edu/4-h/county-fairs/tririvers/</u>, Fair Paper Edits.

#### TRI-RIVERS FAIR ENTRY CARDS

With the use of the FairEntry system, there is no need for anyone to handwrite their fair entry cards. Entry cards have been printed and are available for pick up at the Salina Extension Office. They are organized by club in alphabetical order by last name. We ask that the individual picking up the cards legibly fill out the Entry Card Sign-Out Sheet with the 4-H member's first and last name, club and name of who is picking them up. Because we have the cards placed right inside the first door as you enter the Extension Office, you can come anytime during the day or night to pick them up. Here are some important items to note:

- There will be <u>NO</u> exhibit cards for the following Divisions: Beef Cattle, Bucket Calf, Dairy Goat, Dog, Horse, Meat Goat, Performing Arts (performance entries), Pets (cats and hand pets), Poultry, Rabbit, Sheep, Shooting Sports (fair shoot), and Swine.
- You will <u>NOT</u> pick up exhibit cards for the following Divisions: Banners and Fashion Revue.
- Entry cards and any other documents need to be attached when you arrive to check in your exhibits.
- Refer to the individual project(s) in the Fair Paper for specific instructions on attaching the entry card and/or any other items that need to accompany the exhibit.
- <u>Do not</u> separate the 2 entry cards.
- If needed, punch a hole in first entry card in upper left-hand corner to attach to exhibit.
- <u>Do not</u> fold the 2 cards together and hole punch.
- Use string, masking or blue tape, to attach entry card.
- Call the Extension Office before Friday, July 25, 12:00 p.m., if you are missing entry cards.
- If you forget an entry card at home, a new one WILL NOT be printed for you.

### ALL ANIMAL DISMISSAL

All animals will be released on Sunday after the Awards Ceremony. Load out of beef, sheep and meat goats will be announced at a later date.

#### FAIR CLEAN UP

Fair clean up for the Tri-Rivers Fair will be at 4:00 p.m. on Monday, July 28. Clean up will take place in the livestock areas and the 4-H Building. We will have an assorted variety of snacks available for our volunteers. Please plan to attend.



#### ATTENTION: DOG PROJECT, PERFORMING ARTS & SHOPPING IN STYLE EXHIBITORS

If you pre-entered a poster or display or poster for the Tri-Rivers Fair, don't forget to bring it to the judging event.

- Dog Show, Saturday, July 26, 8:00 a.m.
- Performing Arts, Sunday, July 27, 1:30 p.m.
- Shopping in Style, Sunday July 27, 1:00 p.m.

One of the judges at these events will judge these exhibits. If it is not brought to these events, it will not be judged. Don't forget to bring the judged poster or display to the Tri-Rivers Fair on Tuesday so we can display it inside the 4-H Building.

### **CONFERENCE JUDGING DETAILS**

#### <u>Sign-up</u>

Members will need to go to <u>https://www.centralkansas.k-state.edu/4-h/county-fairs/tririvers/</u> to sign up for conference judging between 12:00 a.m. (midnight) and 11:59 p.m. on Sunday, July 27. <u>This is for exhibits in the 4-H building and does not include livestock</u>. Individuals will sign up for conference judging times by project. We ask that you sign up for the earliest time you possibly can.

The 4-H divisions that DO NOT need to sign up for a conference judging time include:

Pets - Check in by 12:30 p.m. on Saturday, August 2 in the 4-H Building. • Cats will be shown in class order.

 $\circ$  Hand Pets will follow Cats and shown in class order.

- Performing Arts (pre-scheduled) Schedule will be emailed to exhibitors soon.
- Fashion Revue (pre-scheduled) Schedule will be emailed to exhibitors soon.

If you have any issues signing up for a conference judging time, please email <u>klittich@ksu.edu</u>, briefly describing your issue. Please know you will not receive an immediate response, but it will be responded to as soon as possible.

#### When You Come to Conference Judging

Please plan to arrive at least 5 minutes before your scheduled conference judging time. For the exhibits in the 4-H building, conference judging occurs between the 4-H member and the judge. It is a great opportunity for the 4-H member to explain what they did, what they learned and what may have been challenging. The judge will ask questions, and these questions should be answered by the 4-H member. One or two adults may accompany the 4-H member for conference judging.

#### Not able to Conference Judge In-Person?

If the 4-H member / 4-H family are not able to conference judge in-person, we ask that the Conference Judging Form be completed for <u>each individual</u> entry. This form may be downloaded from <u>https://www.centralkansas.k-state.edu/4-h/county-fairs/tririvers/</u> Make sure this form is attached securely to each entry when brought in on Tuesday, July 29. In addition, sign up for a conference judging time as you would, if coming to the conference judging in-person. In the block where you put your last name, follow it with "Judging Form" (i.e., Last Name: *Smith Judging Form*), and sign up for the last time slot available.

# ATTENTION: 4-H FOODS, FOODS PRESERVATION, FIBER ARTS AND SEWING & TEXTILE DESIGN COUNTY FAIR EXHIBITORS

#### Required for County and State Fair - Check your County Fair Paper for County Fair Requirements:

In Sewing & Textile Design, Fiber Arts and Fashion Revue, a label may be made out of cloth is needed and can be written on with a permanent or laundry type marker. Labels should be about  $3" \ge 2\frac{1}{2}"$  in size and include exhibitor name, class number and Central Kansas District.

Food preservation labels need to include: 4-H member's name, class number, product, altitude where processed, canning method, processing time, pressure (psi), date processed (including month and year), and Central Kansas District. A template can be found in the Fair Paper under the Food Preservation 4-H Division.

Food labels need to include: food product name, 4-H member's name, class number, and Central Kansas District. A template can be found in the Fair Paper under the Foods and Nutrition 4-H Division.

#### **ATTENTION: 4-H PHOTOGRAPHY EXHIBITORS**

If you are enrolled in photography, please make sure you understand the information below as you prepare for the county fair.

- Photographic subject matter is expected to follow 4-H standards. For a sense of prohibited subject matter, review the Kansas 4-H member Code of Conduct; in general, if it is not allowable at a 4-H event, it is not allowable in a 4-H photograph at the County or State Fair.
- Photos with live subject(s) on A railroad right of way or taken from railroad right of way property will not be displayed in Kansas 4-H Photography and will be disqualified without being judged.
- Copyright protections must be observed.
- Decisions as to display and/or penalties will be made by the Photography Department Superintendent and Extension Staff.

#### FOODS AND FOODS PRESERVATION – WEDNESDAY, JULY 30

All food preservation will be judged at the same time as the 4-H Food Division, **Wednesday, July 30**, with the foods judges (1 or 2 judges will be designated for Food Preservation exhibits). This division is judged based on the individual judging schedule as members signed up for times. **Special Note:** To ensure the health and safety of all fair participants and judges, we will no longer be accepting perishable food items as fair entries. Please see Rule #9 in the 2025 Tri-Rivers Fair Paper.

### **REMEMBER - FOODS & NUTRITION RULE**

Please be sure to take note of Rule #20 in the 2024 Tri-Rivers Fair Paper. It states:

For food safety, any entries with frostings and fillings (including glazes), must calculate the amount of sugar in the frosting/filling recipe only. The calculation must be attached to the entry, or the placing will be lowered one ribbon when judged. Frosting and fillings need to contain more than 65% sugar for safety. #### PERFORMING ARTS - SUNDAY, JULY 27 - NEW DAY & TIME

The Performing Arts Division will be held Sunday, August 4. A special encore performance opportunity will be available during the Fashion Revue at 7:00 p.m. on Sunday, August 4 for the Reserve and Grand Champions in each class (Junior, Senior and Ensemble).

The schedule will be emailed and posted online for individuals and groups based on the pre-entries. Participants are asked to check-in with the Superintendent or Assistant Superintendent at least <u>15 minutes prior</u> to your assigned time. We can be flexible with the time if need be, but if you don't check-in, we don't know that you are not a scratch. Thank you!



#### SEW YOU'RE MODELING YOUR OUTFIT AT FASHION REVUE...

When you are writing your script for Fashion Revue, keep these helpful hints in mind:

- Start with an attention-getting sentence.
- Share a few facts about YOU. What is your name? What 4-H club do you belong to?
- Tell a few facts about your outfit. What are you wearing? Did you make it or buy it? Does it have any interesting features and/or accessories?
- Show the judge you know about your project. How much did it cost? How much time did it take? What do you like best about your outfit? Where do you plan to wear it?
- Tie in any fun stories about the making/buying of your outfit.
- Finish your script with a fun sentence to tie it all together.
- Bring scripts with you to judging on Sunday, July 27.

#### **FASHION REVUE JUDGING**

The fashion revue judging will take place on <u>Sunday, July 27</u>. Fashion Revue will begin at 1:00 p.m. The judging schedule will be emailed and posted online. Please enter the doors on the west side of the building. **Judging will be at the First Christian Church, 2727 E. Crawford, Salina**. *No animals are allowed for this contest.* 

An evaluation form must be filled out and presented at the time you are judged. Entry cards will be available for you to pick up at judging!

Intermediate divisions, Classes 6005 and 6020 (10-13 year olds) and senior divisions Classes 6000 and 6010 (14 years old and older) are required to have a cost per wear form completed for judging.

Please be ready at least 15 minutes before your scheduled time for Fashion Revue Judging.

#### **GRIEVANCE COMMITTEE FOR THE 4-H DIVISIONS AT THE FAIR**



We have a committee for 4-H to take grievances throughout the year. This same committee will take grievances from the county fair. Disputes should first be brought to the attention of the appropriate 4-H Division Superintendent and Extension Staff. After receiving a decision from the department Superintendent or staff member, any further dispute must be made in writing (within 2-3 hours of the decision by 4-H division superintendent or staff member), using the form available online <u>http://www.centralkansas.ksu.edu/4-h</u> under County Fairs, Tri-Rivers Fair. A hard copy can also be obtained from the 4-H Division Superintendent or Extension Staff. To receive a ruling from the

grievance committee, the dispute form must be accompanied by a \$50 fee (cash, personal check or money order made payable to "4-H Council"). The grievance committee will review the complaint and will get back with the individual named on the complaint form as soon as possible via email. The fee will be refunded upon the ruling from the Grievance Committee. If no decision is reached due to lack of information, the fee will not be refunded. Any collected fees will be considered a tax-deductible donation to 4-H Council.

- Salina Area 4-H Members
  - Foods and Horticulture projects can be brought on Wednesday, September 3, along with the other projects before 4:00 p.m.
  - If a member has projects other than Foods & Horticulture, please bring those on August 28, or September 2 and 3 between 8:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. We will not be accepting entries on Friday, August 29.
- Livestock entries are **DUE ONLINE July 15** to the Kansas State Fair. Entries are available on-line at <a href="https://www.kansasstatefair.com/p/competitions">https://www.kansasstatefair.com/p/competitions</a>. This includes Market Beef, Breeding Beef, Market Meat Goat, Breeding Meat Goat, Market Sheep, Breeding Sheep, Market Swine, and Breeding Swine.
- Information about volunteering at the Kansas State Fair will be emailed out through 4-H Online as soon as it is available. The deadline to sign up is usually the end of July.
