Fair Paper, 4-H Divisions

The Fair Paper is currently on the Central Kansas District website <http://www.centrankansas.ksu.edu/4-h> under County Fairs, Tri-Rivers Fair. We strongly encourage 4-H members and parents to check the Fair Paper periodically because when typos are found, we update the Fair Paper. Be sure to check the Fair Paper for the last date it was updated, as the date it was updated will be located on each page in the upper right-hand corner. If edits are necessary, these are noted in the "Fair Paper Edits" document located at the link above.

Tri-Rivers Fair Entry Cards

Entry cards have been printed and are available for pick up at the Salina Extension Office. They are organized by club in alphabetical order by last name. We ask that the individual picking up the cards legibly fill out the Entry Card Sign-Out Sheet with the 4-H member's first and last name, club and name of who is picking them up. Because we have the cards placed right inside the first door as you enter the Extension Office, you can come anytime during the day or night to pick them up. Here are some important items to note:

- There will be **NO** exhibit cards for the following Divisions: Banner (club), Beef Cattle, Bucket Calf, Dairy Cattle, Dairy Goat, Dog, Fashion Revue, Horse, Meat Goat, Performing Arts (performance entries), Pets (cats and hand pets), Poultry, Rabbit, Sheep, Shooting Sports (fair shoot), and Swine.
- **Entry cards and any other documents/items need to be attached to the exhibit when you arrive to check in your exhibits on Tuesday, July 28.**
- Refer to the individual project(s) in the Fair Paper for specific instructions on attaching the entry card and/or any other documents/items that need to accompany the exhibit.
- Do not separate the 2 entry cards.
- If needed, punch a hole in first entry card in upper left-hand corner to attach to exhibit.
- Do not fold the 2 cards together and hole punch.
- Use string, masking or blue tape to attach entry card.
- Call the Extension Office before **Friday, July 24, 12:00 p.m.**, if you are missing entry cards.
- **If you forget an entry card at home, a new one WILL NOT be printed for you.**

Fair Clean Up

Fair clean up for the Tri-Rivers Fair will be at 4:00 p.m. on Monday, July 27. Clean up will take place in the livestock areas and the 4-H Building. We will have an assorted variety of snacks available for our volunteers. Please plan to attend.

Conference Judging Details

Sign-up

Members will receive an email the Friday before sign-up and again on Sunday with a link and instructions to sign up for conference judging times. **Sign-up is from 12:00 a.m. (midnight) to 11:59 p.m., Sunday, July 26.** This is for exhibits in the 4-H building **ONLY** and does not include Animal Science Divisions 1-12. The link will not be posted on the CKD website, so please watch your email. Individuals will sign up for conference judging times by project. We ask that you sign up for the earliest time you possibly can.

The 4-H divisions that **DO NOT** need to sign up for a conference judging time include:

- Pets - Check in by **2:30 p.m. Saturday, August 1** in the 4-H Building.
 - Cats will be shown in class order.
 - Hand Pets will follow Cats and shown in class order.
- Performing Arts (pre-scheduled) - Schedule will be emailed to exhibitors and posted to the website.
- Fashion Revue (pre-scheduled) - Schedule will be emailed to exhibitors and posted to the website.



If you have any issues signing up for a conference judging time, please email Ellie at ev13104@ksu.edu, briefly describing your issue. Please know you will not receive an immediate response, but it will be responded to as soon as possible.

When You Come to Conference Judging

Please plan to arrive at least 5 minutes before your scheduled conference judging time. For the exhibits in the 4-H building, conference judging occurs between the 4-H member and the judge. It is a great opportunity for the 4-H member to explain what they did, what they learned and what may have been challenging. The judge will ask questions, and these questions should be answered by the 4-H member. One or two adults may accompany the 4-H member for conference judging.

Not able to Conference Judge In-Person?

If a 4-H member is not able to conference judge in-person, we ask that the Conference Judging Form be completed for **each individual** entry. This form may be downloaded from <https://www.centrankansas.k-state.edu/4-h/county-fairs/tririvers/> Make sure this form is attached securely to each entry when brought in on **Tuesday, July 28**. In addition, sign up for a conference judging time as you would, if coming to the conference judging in-person. In the block where you put your last name, follow it with "Judging Form" (i.e., Last Name: *Smith Judging Form*), and sign up for the last time slot available.

Bedding for Tri-Rivers Fair

This is a reminder that livestock exhibitors are responsible for providing their own bedding and feed this year.

Please note:

- Hay and straw will not be available for purchase at the fair.
- The exhibitor must provide all bedding.
- Swine stalls may not be bedded.

Please make arrangements for bedding and feed before arriving at the fair.

Herdsmen Award

The Herdsman Award recognizes clubs that excel in animal care, area cleanliness, stall appearance, and exhibit arrangement during the county fair. Species include Dairy Goats, Dairy Cattle, Horses, Bucket Calves, Beef Cattle, Swine, Meat Goats, Sheep, and, new for 2026, Rabbits and Poultry. Demonstrating excellent herdsman practices showcases the hard work and pride of our 4-H members while creating a positive impression for the public, sponsors, and new or prospective 4-H families. It also helps provide a welcoming and educational environment for members who are learning.

Herdsmanship is judged by 4-H club within each division, with judging conducted twice daily throughout the fair. Awards will be presented during the county fair awards ceremony.

All Animal Dismissal

Animal Science exhibits (Divisions 1-13) and livestock not selling in the Premium Auction are released following the Awards Ceremony on Sunday. All remaining Animal Science exhibits and livestock must be released following the Livestock Premium Auction on Monday. Non-sale animals may remain until then for easier departure.

Attention: Dog Project Exhibitors

If you pre-entered a poster, display, notebook, or educational exhibit for the Tri-Rivers Fair, don't forget to bring it to the CKD 4-H Fair and Open Class Show on **Saturday, July 25**.

- Dog Show, **Saturday, July 25, 8:00 a.m.** One of the judges will judge these exhibits. If it is not brought to these events, it will not be judged. Don't forget to bring the judged poster, display, notebook, or educational exhibit to the Tri-Rivers Fair on Tuesday so we can display it inside the 4-H Building.

COMMUNICATION & EXPRESSIVE ART

Attention: 4-H Photography Exhibitors

If you are enrolled in photography, please make sure you understand the information below as you prepare for the county fair.

- Photographic subject matter is expected to follow 4-H standards. For a sense of prohibited subject matter, review the Kansas 4-H member Code of Conduct; in general, if it is not allowable at a 4-H event, it is not allowable in a 4-H photograph at the County or State Fair.
- Photos with live subject(s) on a railroad right of way or taken from railroad right of way property will not be displayed in Kansas 4-H Photography and will be disqualified without being judged.
- Copyright protections must be observed.
- Decisions as to display and/or penalties will be made by the Photography Department Superintendent and Extension Staff.
- **DO NOT** write any information on the back of the photo mat board. Name and club can be written on the front in pencil but **MUST** be completely covered by the ID strip.

Performing Arts Judging – Sunday, July 26, 1:30 p.m.

First Christian Church, 2727 E. Crawford, Salina

The judging schedule will be emailed and posted online for individuals and groups based on the pre-entries. Please enter the doors on the west side of the building.

Participants are asked to check-in with the Superintendent or Assistant Superintendent at least 15 minutes prior to your scheduled time for Performing Arts Judging. We can be flexible with the time if need be, but if you don't check-in, we don't know that you are not a scratch. Thank you!

A special encore performance opportunity will be available during the public Fashion Revue at 7:00 p.m. on Sunday, July 26 for the Reserve and Grand Champion members in each class (Junior, Senior and Ensemble).



Attention: Performing Arts Exhibitors

If you pre-entered a poster, display, notebook, or educational exhibit for the Tri-Rivers Fair, don't forget to bring it to the judging event.

- Performing Arts, **Sunday, July 26, 1:30 p.m.**

One of the judges will judge these exhibits. If it is not brought to these events, it will not be judged. Don't forget to bring the judged poster, display, notebook, or educational exhibit to the Tri-Rivers Fair on Tuesday so we can display it inside the 4-H Building.

FAMILY & CONSUMER SCIENCE

Foods & Nutrition and Foods Preservation

Foods & Nutrition Labels: On the label, include the food product name, 4-H member's name, class number, and Central Kansas District. A template can be found in the Fair Paper under the Foods and Nutrition 4-H Division. The label needs to be placed on the bottom of the disposable plate or cardboard the food item is on.

Food Preservation Labels: On the label, include the 4-H member's name, class number, product, altitude where processed, canning method, processing time, pressure (psi), date processed (including month and year), and Central Kansas District. A template can be found in the Fair Paper under the Food Preservation 4-H Division.

Foods & Nutrition Exhibit Cards and Recipes: Attach in this order, entry card and recipe, to the **outside** of the exhibit container or bag, and attach with tape or string. **DO NOT** place inside.

Foods & Nutrition and Foods Preservation Judging: ALL exhibits will be judged on **Wednesday, July 29**, according to the individual judging schedule based on the time each member signed up for. Two judges will be designated for Food Preservation exhibits. This division is judged based on the individual judging times schedule, as members signed up for.

Perishable Food Items No Longer Accepted: Rule #11 in the 2026 Tri-Rivers Fair Paper states:

To ensure the health and safety of all fair participants and judges, we will no longer be accepting perishable food items as fair entries. Perishable food includes all items that must be kept hot or cold – like dairy products, fresh meats, cream pies, or anything with fresh fruit or uncooked eggs.

Frostings and Fillings (Including Glazes): Please be sure to take note of Rule #21 in the 2026 Tri-Rivers Fair Paper. It states:

For food safety, any entries with frostings and fillings (including glazes), must calculate the amount of sugar in the frosting/filling recipe only. The calculation must be attached to the entry, or the placing will be lowered one ribbon when judged. Frosting and fillings need to contain more than 65% sugar for safety.

Fiber Arts, Sewing & Textile Design, and Shopping In Style

Sewing & Textile Design and Fiber Arts Check In and Judging: ALL exhibits in these divisions need to be brought during exhibit **check in on Tuesday, July 28** and will be **judged on Wednesday, July 29** according to the individual judging schedule based on the time each member signed up for.



Shopping In Style: ALL exhibits in this division, including purchased garments/outfits worn in the Fashion Revue will need to be brought during exhibit **check in on Tuesday, July 28**.

- **Poster, tri-fold display, and educational display exhibits** will be judged on **Wednesday, July 29** according to the individual judging schedule based on the time each member signed up for.
- **Purchased garments/outfits** to be worn in the Fashion Revue will be judged on **Sunday, July 26** according to the schedule that will be emailed and posted online.

Fiber Arts and Sewing & Textile Design Labels: Each Sewing & Textile Design garment or article and each fiber art exhibit must be labeled. Identification labels need to include a typed or printed 3" x 2 ½" piece of cloth: class number, county or district, and exhibitor's name. Printed labels can be written with a permanent or laundry type marker.

PLANT SCIENCES

Horticulture & Landscape Design: Place exhibit on a sturdy plate, bowl or container that will support the weight of the produce. Attach the exhibit card with tape or hole punch the plate, bowl or container and attach the exhibit card with string. For single stem flowers and flower arrangements, hole punch the exhibit card and attach to the vase or container with string or a rubberband.

ADDITIONAL DIVISIONS

Sew You're Modeling Your Outfit At Fashion Revue...

When you are writing your script for Fashion Revue, keep these helpful hints in mind:

- Start with an attention-getting sentence.
- Share a few facts about YOU. What is your name? What 4-H club do you belong to?
- Tell a few facts about your outfit. What are you wearing? Did you make it or buy it? Does it have any interesting features and/or accessories?
- Show the judge you know about your project. How much did it cost? How much time did it take? What do you like best about your outfit? Where do you plan to wear it?
- Tie in any fun stories about the making/buying of your outfit.
- Finish your script with a fun sentence to tie it all together.
- Bring scripts with you to judging on Sunday, July 26.

Fashion Revue Judging – Sunday, July 26, 1:00 p.m.

First Christian Church, 2727 E. Crawford, Salina

The judging schedule will be emailed and posted online for individuals based on the pre-entries. Please enter the doors on the west side of the building.

Fashion Revue Labels for Tri-Rivers Fair: Each garment or article exhibited must be labeled with 3" x 2 ½" cloth label (name and club) and attached with safety pin or sewn in. Labels may be made out of cloth and can be written on with a permanent or laundry type marker. **Fashion Revue Labels for Kansas State Fair:** Labels should be about 3" x 2 ½" in size and include exhibitor name, class number and Central Kansas District.

No animals are allowed for this contest.

An evaluation form **MUST BE** filled out and presented at the time you are judged. Entry cards will be available for you to pick up at judging.

Intermediate and Senior Classes are required to have a cost per wear form completed for judging.

- Intermediate Classes (*10-13 year olds*): 6005 and 6020
- Senior Classes (*14 years old and older*): 6000 and 6010

Please be ready at least 15 minutes prior to your scheduled time for Fashion Revue Judging.

The 4-H Awards Ceremony will be held Sunday, August 2 at 4:00 p.m. in the 4-H Building. There will be approximately 75-100 chairs that will be placed, but it is still recommended that you bring a lawn chair just in case.

Exhibits in the 4-H Building can be picked up immediately following the 4-H Awards Ceremony.

Open Class Entries

4-H members may enter in the Open Class Exhibits in Kenwood Hall. Please consult the Open Class rules for more information. 4-H members may not enter in any class in Open Class Divisions 19 and 20.

We have a committee for 4-H to take grievances throughout the year. This same committee will take grievances from the county fair. Disputes should first be brought to the attention of the appropriate 4-H Division Superintendent and Extension Staff. After receiving a decision from the department Superintendent or staff member, any further dispute must be made in writing (within 2-3 hours of the decision by 4-H division superintendent or staff member), using the form available online <http://www.centrankansas.ksu.edu/4-h> under County Fairs, Tri-Rivers Fair. A hard copy can also be obtained from the 4-H Division Superintendent or Extension Staff. To receive a ruling from the grievance committee, the dispute form must be accompanied by a \$50 fee (cash, personal check or money order made payable to "4-H Council"). The grievance committee will review the complaint and will get back with the individual named on the complaint form as soon as possible via email. The fee will be refunded upon the ruling from the Grievance Committee. If no decision is reached due to lack of information, the fee will not be refunded. Any collected fees will be considered a tax-deductible donation to 4-H Council.

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Kansas State Fair Information

Qualifications to exhibit: 4-H member must be 9 before January 1, 2026, their project must have received a purple at the county fair and a class must be available at the State Fair.

Check the State Fair web page for other details. Our staff will take your non-livestock 4-H exhibits to the Kansas State Fair for you, as long as they fit within specific size and weight criteria.

- State Fair pre-entries are DUE:
 - **July 23 by 5:00 p.m. for Minneapolis Area Clubs** in the Ottawa County Extension Office.
 - **August 4 by 12:00 p.m. Noon for Salina Area Clubs** in the Saline County Extension Office.

The 4-H exhibits that must be pre-entered by the 4-H family are:

 - 4-H Club Day, purple ribbon talent qualifies for State Fair. Due online to Extension Office July 1 by 11:59 p.m. Please refer to email sent on May 4.
- **Rabbit / Poultry / Dog:**
 - Minneapolis Area Clubs - Contact the Ottawa County Extension Office.
 - Salina Area Clubs - Pick up a form from the project superintendent, on stage at the fair or at the Salina Extension Office.
- **Fashion Revue:**
 - Minneapolis Area Clubs - Contact the Ottawa County Extension Office.
 - Salina Area Clubs - Forms and other information will be given to members who qualify on the night of the Public Fashion Revue.

When coming into the Extension Office, please allow time to prepare your exhibit, as you are responsible for attaching all information to the entry and packaging. Entry cards will be picked up at the Extension Office when you bring in your exhibits.

- **Minneapolis Area 4-H Members**
 - Food and Horticulture projects must be at the Minneapolis office no later than 4:00 p.m. on Wednesday, September 9.
- **Salina Area 4-H Members**
 - Foods and Horticulture projects can be brought on Wednesday, September 9, along with the other projects before 4:00 p.m.
 - If a member has projects other than Foods & Horticulture, please bring those on September 3, 8, or 9 between 8:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. We will not be accepting entries on Friday, September 4.
- Livestock entries are **DUE ONLINE July 15** to the Kansas State Fair. Entries are available on-line at <https://www.kansasstatefair.com/p/competitions>. This includes Market Beef, Breeding Beef, Market Meat Goat, Breeding Meat Goat, Market Sheep, Breeding Sheep, Market Swine, and Breeding Swine.
- Horse Show entries are **DUE ONLINE** August 1 at <https://kansaseq.fairwire.com>.
- Information about volunteering at the Kansas State Fair will be emailed out through 4-H Online as soon as it is available. The deadline to sign up is usually the end of July.

2026 Tri-Rivers Fair 4-H Judging Schedule
