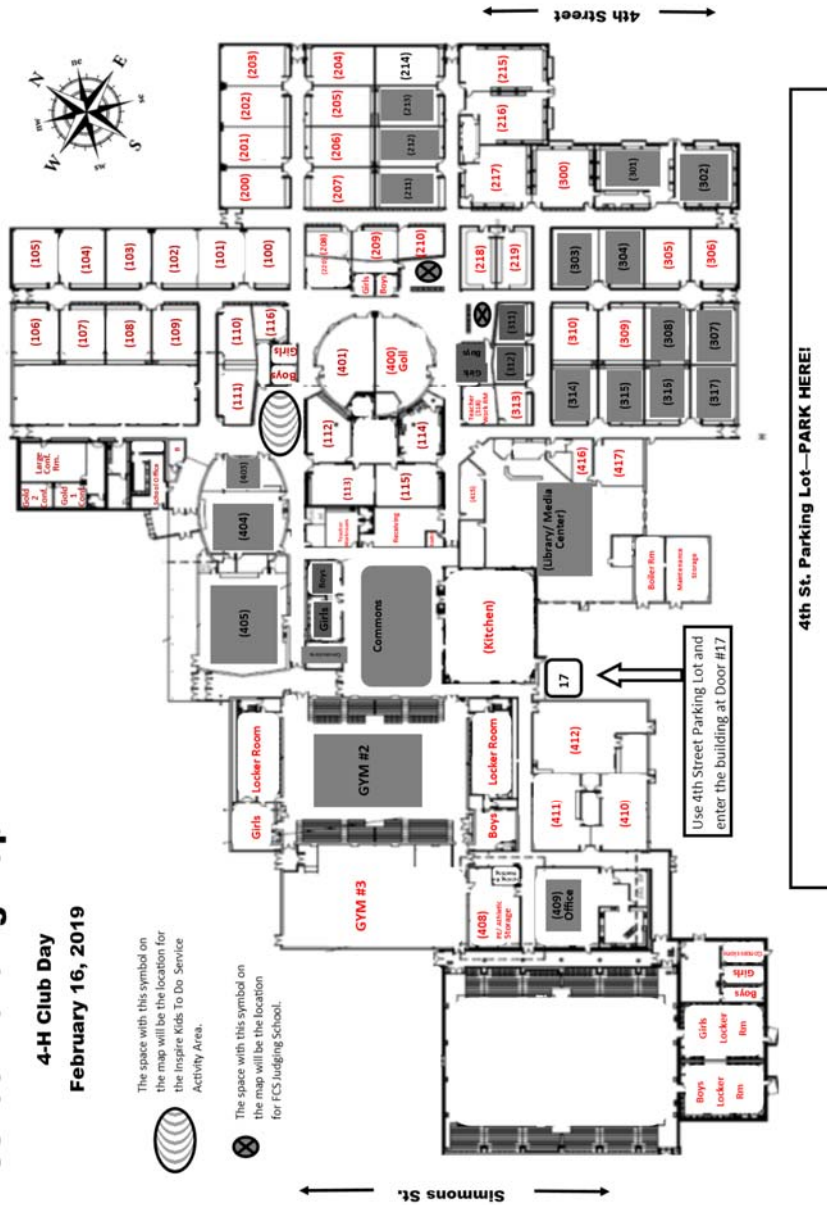

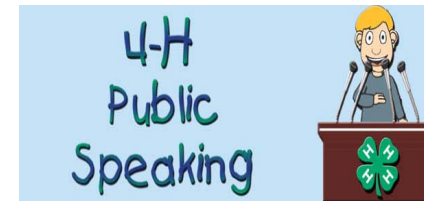

As an extension of the districtwide Home Environment Project, we will be collecting items to be assembled into Home Starter Kits for people/families in need who may be starting over with their households through the Salina Shares program. Salina Shares began as a group simply extending acts of kindness and has developed into a multi-faceted program continuing to extend those acts of kindness in addition to meeting the needs of those in crisis situations or just trying to get back on their feet. When considering donations for this project, please note that new items are preferred. The districtwide project members will be assembling the kits at a later date, but the items needed are: laundry baskets, air mattresses with pumps (for those who don't have beds), blankets, dishes, pots/pans, silverware, towels, dish soap, multi-surface cleaner/wipes, toilet bowl cleaner/brush, toilet paper, & paper towels.
