We will be using Fair Entry system again this year for Ottawa County Fair pre-entries. The online entry system will streamline the entry process, check-ins, shows, and results.



Online pre-entries will be required for all exhibitors for all exhibits being entered.



<u>The deadline for pre-entries to be entered</u> <u>online is June 16 at 11:59 p.m.</u>

You will be able to log in anytime to add, delete or edit your entries before the preentry deadline. Information and instructions were emailed to all Ottawa County families on May 30.

Exhibitors <u>will not</u> be allowed to pre-enter anything after the deadline, as in previous years.

Kansas State Fair Qualifier Reminder

REMINDER

Any demonstration, illustrated talk, project talk, public speaking, or Drama: Reading receiving a purple at the Central Kansas District 4-H

Club Day may be entered, unless it has previously been entered in this contest or does not meet the guidelines. Members must be 9 years of age and not have passed their 19th birthday before January 1, 2025, to participate at the Kansas State Fair. An email was sent on May 5 to all CKD 4-H members who qualified.

Each member may enter up to two exhibits in 4-H Communications but only one entry per class. - **DO NOT WAIT** until the last minute to pre-enter your fair exhibits.
- If you do not have access to a device or an internet connection to complete your online pre-entries, you are welcome to come to either Extension Office, or you may opt to use your local public library.
- Specific information regarding each fair's pre-entries may be found in each fair paper.
- If you have any questions about the pre-entry process, please do not hesitate to contact the Salina Extension Office.
- <u>REMEMBER, each individual exhibit must be pre-entered.</u>
- Deadline for all Ottawa County Fair pre-entries is June 16, 11:59 p.m.
- Deadline for all Tri-Rivers Fair pre-entries is June 23, 11:59 p.m.

Ottawa County Farm Bureau Holds 4-H Photo Contest

The Ottawa County Farm Bureau Association is proud to announce the Annual 4-H Photography Contest. The purpose of this contest is to promote agriculture in Ottawa County. The contest is open to all current Ottawa County 4-H members. The photo must have been taken in Ottawa County. The photo could be of animals, crops, equipment, landscape, water sources, farm buildings, or grains, but please, no people should be in the picture. All photographs should be 8"x10" and be submitted to the Farm Bureau Financial Services offices by 4:00 p.m., Monday, July 7, 2025. Prize money will be 1st place \$50, 2nd place \$30 and 3rd place \$20. Any picture submitted for this contest cannot be entered into the Ottawa County Fair. Winners will be announced at the Ottawa County Fair on Friday, July 18. Winning photographs become the property of the Ottawa County Farm Bureau. Minimum Livestock Weights at County Fair

The minimum weights for livestock to be eligible for grand or reserve champion and be eligible to sell in the premium auction at the 2025 Ottawa County Fair and 2025 Tri-Rivers Fair are as follows:

Beef: 1,000 lbs

Meat Goats: 50 lbs

Sheep: 90 lbs

Swine: 220 lbs

Livestock Premium Auction Policy Change

Attention Livestock Exhibitors: Due to recent policy changes at the state and local levels, livestock that have sold through the Ottawa County Fair and Tri-Rivers Fair Livestock Sales are now eligible to show at the Kansas State Fair and Kansas Junior Livestock Show, as long as they have not changed ownership. Please feel free to give the Extension Office a call if you have any questions.



Important Fair Update: No Perishable Entries Accepted

To ensure the health and safety of all fair participants and visitors, we will no longer be accepting *perishable* food items as fair entries. This change aligns with current food safety guidelines and helps us maintain a safe environment for all. We appreciate your understanding and encourage you to continue showcasing your talents with non-perishable food items and other creative entries!

Perishable foods are items that must be kept hot or cold — like dairy products, fresh meats, cream pies, or anything with fresh fruit or uncooked eggs. *Non-perishable foods* are shelf-stable and safe to display at room temperature—like cookies, breads, jams, canned goods, or dried foods.

Fair Ribbons & Trophies

Do you have a great display idea for ribbons and trophies? Does your 4-H Member keep a scrapbook of ribbons? If so, we'd love to see pictures of how your family displays ribbons and trophies after the events. Please send pictures to <u>klittich@ksu.edu</u> to share your great ideas!

We've also heard from several families they'd like to see a "recycle" option for ribbons and/or trophies, so we are starting one! If your family would like to "recycle" ribbons or trophies, a collection box will be available. Ribbons should be unmarked and can be from any CKD 4-H event (shows, 4-H Club Day, fairs, etc.). Trophies can also be placed in the collection box as they can usually be repurposed by having a new plate made. These items may also be dropped off at either Extension Office to be added to the recycle program.

Can Projects Be Made At School?

Concerned about managing time and resources? You might consider combining 4-H and school projects. However, a few guidelines must be considered before combining, as a definite "yes" or "no" cannot be given across the board for all projects. To help determine if projects can serve the dual roles, ask yourself:

- Will you plan ahead of time to correlate the projects for better use of time and money?
- Will the 4-H project you are enrolled in have similar suggested learning requirements as the school project?
- Will the project be a part of the suggested learning and/or requirements in both the 4-H & school projects?

If you can honestly answer YES to the above questions, then you can legitimize combining the two projects. However . . .

- If you wait to enroll in a 4-H project after the school project is completed and select a "project" that fits the completed school project . . . or
- If you do no advanced planning but instead decide at the last minute to enter the completed school project at the fair because it's done . . . then . . . the project is not considered eligible as a 4-H project.

Take time now and pre-plan...it will save you from confusion in the end. Note: There may be some specific rules for exhibiting at the county fair (i.e., if you have entered an item you made at school, you may also have to enter an item you make at home). Please refer to the fair paper to make sure you are able to meet the requirements for exhibiting at the fair.

General Guidelines on Copyright

4-H exhibitors (individuals or group) should avoid using copyrighted materials whenever possible by originating his/her own work. A 4-H member or group should use with caution a copyrighted and/or trademarked product or service (a brand name, label or product). The intent of using the copyright or trademark materials for educational purposes such as an exhibit, educational poster/display or public presentation is acceptable under the "Fair Use" (legal use) provision.

"Fair Use" is a provision of the current copyright law that allows reproduction without payment or permission of limited portions of a copyrighted work for educational and other public interest purposes. Regardless of the "Fair Use" provision, the reference that a specific name brand project is good or bad inherently or through comparison must be done cautiously, using acceptable research/comparison methods and have a disclaimer that the conclusions are those of the 4-H participant and not those of K-State Research and Extension.

A copyright and trademark are legal methods used by writers, artists, corporations and others to protect their original work. Protected items may range from books to music and logos to computer graphics. Copyrighted and/or trademarked materials utilized in banners, displays, demonstrations, posters or other activities for endorsement or promotion instead of educational purposes will be disqualified and will not receive ribbon and premium and will not be displayed.

The use and inclusion of specific brand names for educational purposes does not imply endorsement or refusal by the Department of Extension 4-H Youth Programs, Kansas State University Agriculture Experiment Station and Cooperative Extension, or the State of Kansas.

Outstanding 4-H Member

- Self-entered into earning title by submitting a Project Award Application (formerly known as the KAP)
- Focus on citizenship and leadership skills within a 4-H project
- Includes an interview with emphasis on 4-H
- Winner represents their club within Central Kansas District 4-H

Tri-Rivers Fair King & Queen

- Nominated by peers
- Focus on life skills, skills that can be gained through 4-H experiences
- Includes a resume that includes all life experiences that represent citizenship and leadership
- Includes an interview with an emphasis on a wellrounded individual with experiences within and outside of 4-H
- Includes a thank-you note focusing on content, format and penmanship
- Winner must be a 4-H member and represents the Tri-Rivers Fair event & board

Attention 4-H Families and Organizational Leaders: Central Kansas District Policy

The Central Kansas Extension Board adopted a policy to go alongside the Kansas 4-H Policy regarding fundraising at the February, 2014, Board Meeting. The policy is:

"4-H members MAY NOT solicit funds to help fund their individual 4-H projects. 4-H members may fundraise for a specific 4-H EDUCATIONAL trip. Donations given directly to a 4-H member ARE NOT tax deductible because they do not go to a 4-H club or group. Any fundraising programs by clubs or individuals *MUST* be approved by the 4-H Youth Development Agent; the funds must be used to further the 4-H mission; the account procedures must be appropriate and in accordance with the POLICY: and the 4-H name and emblem must be properly used." Any fundraising done in the name of 4-H needs to be submitted to *Kate.* If the fundraiser is done annually, it should be submitted each time.

Co-Brand

Beginning in October of 2017, the co-wordmark is required on ALL 4-H print, digital, apparel, and merchandise. This requirement applies to all designs created at the local, county, district, area, and state levels. In order to ensure we are in compliance, all 4-H print, digital, apparel, and merchandise being designed or utilized by CKD clubs must be submitted to the 4-H staff. This should be done each time an item is produced, as we need to verify vendors and designs. For instance, if your club uses a shirt design from a previous year, you will need to submit the design for the current year.
