LIVESTOCK INFORMATION

KANSAS STATE FAIR & JUNIOR LIVESTOCK SHOW INFORMATION

All Kansas State Fair and/or Kansas Junior Livestock Show exhibitors are required to complete the YQCA program to be eligible for either show. You will upload your certificate during the online nomination process.

- There is a one-time/year \$20.00 fee if a nomination has to be returned to the family for any reason (i.e., incomplete form).
- Important Dates:
 - June 8 Last day to order Small Animal DNA Envelopes
 - June 15 Small Animal Nominations Due (Mkt Swine, Commercial Gilt, Mkt Lamb, Commercial Ewe, ALL Meat Goat (mkt & breeding), and Commercial Heifers)

There have been recent changes to the nomination process for the Kansas State Fair and/or Kansas Junior Livestock Show. This information can be found on the Central Kansas District 4-H page under 'Livestock Nomination Information' or at <u>https://www.asi.k-state.edu/research-and-extension/youth-</u>

For questions and nomination process information, please refer to the Rookie Guide. *Nominations will be done online and it is important that families plan ahead and start this process early.* A nomination will be required and makes the animal eligible for both the KSF and KJLS. The cost to nominate an animal will be \$12/animal. **Remember, a nomination is not an entry for the show.**

KEY AWARD DUE DATE

The Kansas 4-H Key Award is due to either Extension Office by Monday, September 26, 5 p.m. The application should be submitted by your club's organizational leader. However, the Trips & Awards Committee has decided to give 4-H members the opportunity to submit the application early for it to be



reviewed and to receive feedback. <u>The optional "review" deadline will be Monday, August 29, 5</u> <u>p.m.</u> If a 4-H member submits their Key Award Application by August 29, the Trips & Awards Committee will review it and provide them feedback on what they will need to change in order for the 4-H member to receive the Kansas 4-H Key Award. The revised application would be due on September 26. If a 4-H member does not turn an application in until September 26, 5 p.m., and the application is not thorough, the 4-H member will not receive an opportunity to revise the application. They will have to apply for the award the following year, if eligible.

PULLORUM-TYPHOID (PT) TESTING FOR CHICKENS



Kansas continues to be a Pullorum-Typhoid (P-T) Clean State, which means that all poultry (except waterfowl, pigeons, and market broilers less than 90 days of age) involved in exhibitions, such as the county fair, are REQUIRED to test negative on a pullorum-typhoid test within 90 days prior to the opening date of exhibition.

This year, Central Kansas District will be providing TWO opportunities for you to get your chicken tested. The testing will be free at both locations.

Poultry Pullorum Typhoid testing will be on Monday July 11, 3:30 p.m. – 5:00 p.m. in Minneapolis at the fairgrounds and 5:30 p.m. -7:00 p.m. in Salina at the Extension Office.

Due to travel time between locations, testing in Ottawa county will NOT continue past 5:00 p.m. Please bring your chickens to the testing site earlier than later. If you are attending the Ottawa county location, it is preferred you arrive as close to 3:30 p.m. as possible.

If you cannot make either of the district testing opportunities, finding a certified testing agent to test your chicken(s) will be your responsibility. Remember that NO waterfowl or pigeons need to be tested. Market broilers less than 90 days old do not require testing.

PHOTOGRAPHY THEMED CLASS & ITEMS TO REMEMBER

The theme for the 2022 4-H Photography Competition is **It's All in the Details**. What comes to mind when you think about details? Close-up images is what this themed class will be focusing on.

If you are enrolled in photography, make sure you understand the following as you prepare for the county fair:

- Photographic subject matter is expected to follow 4-H standards. For a sense of prohibited subject matter, review the Kansas 4-H member Code of Conduct; in general, if it is not allowable at a 4-H event, it is not allowable in a 4-H photograph at the State Fair.
- Photos with live subject(s) on railroad right of way or taken from railroad right of way property will not be displayed in Kansas 4-H Photography.
- Copyright protections must be observed.

Decisions as to display and/or penalties will be made by the Photography Superintendent and the Extension Staff.

COUNTY FIRE BANS AND ROCKET LAUNCHES

This is a reminder about Kansas 4-H Rocketry rules as they relate to fire bans in Kansas. While much of Kansas has received good recent rains, the situation can change very rapidly. The 2022 Kansas State Fair rules state "if a fire burn ban is in effect for any county in Kansas, exhibitors in any Kansas county are not required to launch their rocket(s). All requirements for the launching of rockets for the state fair and the documenting of the launching are suspended for the duration of the ban." We advise all counties to be cautious and use good judgment in planning and conducting rocket launches, and consider cancelling them if dry conditions warrant.

GENERAL GUIDELINES ON COPYRIGHT

All 4-H exhibitors (individuals or group) should avoid using copyrighted materials whenever possible by originating his/her own work. A 4-H member or group should use with caution a copyrighted and/or trademarked product or service (a brand name, label or product). The intent of using the copyright or trademark materials for educational purposes such as an exhibit, educational poster/display or public presentation is acceptable under the "Fair Use" (legal use) provision.

"Fair Use" is a provision of the current copyright law that allows reproduction without payment or permission of limited portions of a copyrighted work for educational and other public interest purposes. Regardless of the "Fair Use" provision, the reference that a specific name brand project is good or bad inherently or through comparison must be done cautiously, using acceptable research/comparison methods and have a disclaimer that the conclusions are those of the 4-H participant and not those of K-State Research and Extension.

A copyright and trademark are legal methods used by writers, artists, corporations and others to protect their original work. Protected items may range from books to music and logos to computer graphics. Copyrighted and/or trademarked materials utilized in banners, displays, demonstrations, posters or other activities for endorsement or promotion instead of educational purposes will be disqualified and will not receive ribbon and premium and will not be displayed.

The use and inclusion of specific brand names for educational purposes does not imply endorsement or refusal by the Department of Extension 4-H Youth Programs, Kansas State University Agriculture Experiment Station and Cooperative Extension, or the State of Kansas.





<u>Just a Thought</u>

By bringing an entry to the 4-H Fair, you are asking for a judge's opinion of your work. Although you may not always agree with the judge's decision, remember that you asked for an opinion. Youth are allowed to ask questions of the judge during the consultation time and that may help make it easier to understand the comments that the judge gives.

Judging is not a final grade! It is not a reflection on the 4-H member. A red ribbon animal or garment does not mean that the 4-H member is a red ribbon person! It only means a little more work is needed...that's all!

Parents and project leaders can help a great deal by going through the judging process at home several times before the fair. This may relieve some of the anxieties of fair time. This will make fair time just another opportunity for an opinion.

Conference judging is an excellent opportunity for the 4-H'er to listen to the judge's comments about their product and for the 4-H'er to tell the judge about their product. This exchange should be between the 4-H'er and the judge.

As a parent, it is easy to answer the questions. Please let this be a learning experience for your child. Always speaking for your child only deprives them of the ability to think on their feet and present their own ideas.



CAN PROJECTS BE MADE AT SCHOOL?

Concerned about managing time and resources? You might consider combining 4-H & school projects, however, a few guidelines must be considered before combining, as a definite "yes" or "no" cannot be given across the board for all projects. To help determine if projects can serve the dual roles, ask yourself:

- 1. Will you plan ahead of time to correlate the projects for better use of time and money?
- 2. Will the 4-H project you are enrolled in have similar suggested learning requirements as the school project?
- 3. Will the project be a part of the suggested learning and/or requirements in both the 4-H & school projects?

If you can honestly answer YES to the above questions, then you can legitimize combining the two projects. <u>However...</u>

- 1. If you wait to enroll in a 4-H project after the school project is completed and select a "project" that fits the completed school project...or
- 2. If you do no advanced planning but instead decide at the last minute to enter the completed school project at the fair because it's done. . . then. . . the project is not considered eligible as a 4-H project.

Take time now and pre-plan...it will save you from confusion in the end. Note: There may be some specific rules for exhibiting at the county fair (i.e., if you have entered an item you made at school, you may also have to enter an item you make at home). Please refer to the fair paper to make sure you are able to meet the requirements for exhibiting at the fair.
