Enrollment Deadline

Youth may join 4-H at any time during the 4-H year (October 1) through September 30); however, participating in some parts of the 4-H program may require enrollment or ownership deadlines.

Any 4-H member wishing to participate in the 4-H Club Day contest must be enrolled by December 1. In order to exhibit at the county fair, the enrollment deadline for returning 4-H members is December 1, and for new 4-H members, the deadline is May 1. All 4-H members have the opportunity to add and drop projects. This deadline is May 1. This will allow for mastery in the project(s) for which the 4-H member has enrolled.

4HOnline & Emails

It is important that 4-H Families are receiving emails through 4HOnline. The Central Kansas District tries to eliminate the amount of emails that we send. However, sometimes it is the only means of communication based on the timetable we are given. Everyone is encouraged to make sure their settings are such in 4HOnline that allows for you to receive emails to the email in which is checked the most.

By default, all members are subscribed to 4HOnline email. If you have received an email that you think doesn't pertain to your family and click on unsubscribe, it will unsubscribe you from ALL emails. To check if you are signed up for emails through 4HOnline, pull up your family profile. Click on "Family" on the left side of the page. Next to "Subscribe To Emails?" under the green Family tab, you will see the Yes/No box. Be sure the Yes box is blue. Once you have clicked on the Yes box, you will see a prompt on the screen that says "Opted in to receiving emails." It may take up to 48 hours for the change to take effect.

4-H Council Scholarships

4-H Council scholarships continue to be available for numerous 4-H sponsored events, including virtual events. If you are interested in receiving a scholarship, it is important that you not only complete the 4-H Council Scholarship Application on the website http://www.centralkansas.k-state.edu/4-h under 4-H Member Forms & Documents, but that it is submitted to either Extension Office before 5:00 p.m. on the day of the registration deadline. Any applications received after 5:00 p.m. on the registration deadline will not be considered for a scholarship.

All applications need to be the original application. No emailed applications please.

Farm Service Agency Youth Loan Program

The Farm Service Agency offers a youth loan program for youth who are 10-20 years of age, are involved in a 4-H club and/or FFA chapter, and are interested in starting or expanding an agricultural related business. The purpose of the FSA loan program is to help youth gain knowledge of the importance of the financial and record keeping responsibilities that come with a "business." With a viable business plan, FSA can loan up to \$5,000 to eligible rural youth. The loan must be for a project that is modest sized and an income producing agricultural enterprise. The educational objectives of the FSA youth loan program are to help youth develop skills that will be used throughout their life. K-State Junior Producer Days

Junior Swine Producer Day is Saturday, March 1, 2025, and Junior Meat Goat Producer Day is Saturday, March 22, 2025. Registration is open and limited to 400 attendees, on a first come, first served basis. This is a family event. Anyone attending, including all youth, parents, and adults, must register. If you opt for the paper option, registrations must be received before the event has reached the registration limit, as well as by the deadline listed, to receive a t-shirt.

If they do not complete the 4-H Council Committee Online Request by November 1, 2024, they will be assigned to a committee.

Everyone DOES NOT have to be on 4-H Council in order to serve on a 4-H Council Committee. We encourage 4-H members and adults of all ages to serve on a 4-H Council Committee.

WELCOME NEW 4-H FAMILIES IN STYLE

Make a special effort to welcome all new 4-H members and their families. Try to involve them in club activities--not just at the first meeting, but **throughout** the year. Remember how you felt as a new 4-H member and 4-H family. Help those new to the organization not be overwhelmed. Here are some suggestions to welcome new 4-H families.

- Explain the "sometimes" confusing 4-H terms. Don't assume they understand.
- Form a "mentor" system (or buddy system) by having older 4-H members help new 4-H members with meetings, records and events. Don't forget the parents. Sometimes new parents need a "mentor" too.
- Be sure to give those new to the club a chance to speak up. Involve them in conversations and explain what is happening in the meeting.
- Advise new families of deadlines. Explain the major events that happen in 4-H, such as 4-H Club Day, Gavel Games, 4-H Camp, Fair, etc.
- Let new 4-H families participate at their own pace. Involve them in club activities, but allow them to participate at a level that is comfortable to them.
- *Be aware of special family circumstances and be flexible. All families are an important part of our 4-H program.
- Remember, your club is like a family of sorts. In families, we need to make everyone feel important, help them find their own niche, challenge them to be more involved, and most importantly, accept them for who they are!

Discover Your Future

Kansas 4-H Youth Development and Kansas State University have partnered together to offer academic units. The *Discover Your Future* Career Exploration and Pathway Program will kick off November 1, 2024, with the enrollment and application process. The program will enable 80 high school juniors and seniors who are also 4-H youth (20 per class) to achieve college credit by completing an aligned 4-H project and passing the accompanying K-State introductory-level college course.

The project courses available are:

- Introduction to Personal Financial Planning: 3 credit hours
 - 4-H project area: Family Studies-Consumer Skills
- Introduction to Human Development: 3 credit hours 4-H project area: Family Studies – Child Development, Consumer Skills or Family
- Introduction to Agriculture Communications: 2 credit hours 4-H project area: Creative Arts/Photography and/or Digital Media
- **Communication Public Speaking:** 3 credit hours 4-H project area: Any project area

Students must first enroll in an aligned project area through 4-H Online as a 4-H member. Eligible 4-H youth (Juniors & Seniors in High School) will fill out a **Discover Your Future** Career & Exploration and Pathway application at https://kstate.qualtrics.com/jfe/form/SV o1CbtGRIpzdoPYO. The application due date is December 8, 2024. All applications require signatures of a parent, county agent and school counselor signature. The signature page can be found at https://kstate.qualtrics.com/jfe/form/SV 3F7lB7OtRklWuSG and is also due December 8, 2024.

New Horse ID's - Beginning for the 2024-2025 4-H Year

The Kansas 4-H Horse ID Certificate (P1039) can be found at https://bookstore.ksre.ksu.edu/item/horse-identification-certificate P1039 has been updated for the 2024-2025 4-H program year. Beginning with the 2024-2025 4-H program year, please use the new form and destroy previously used 4-H Horse ID Certificates. As a reminder, to properly identify your horse, complete the 4-H Horse ID Certificate, have your Extension Agent sign it and copy it. A COPY of the Horse ID Certificate is kept on file in the Extension Office, and the 4-H Horse member maintains the ORIGINAL certificate. The original certificate is presented by the 4-H member to show staff for check-in at the local 4-H horse shows. Beginning in 2025, registration papers WILL NOT be accepted to identify horses for the 4-H Horse Project. This will not affect any deadlines within the 4-H Horse Project. Supplemental educational materials will also be released throughout the year to assist 4-H members, leaders and Extension staff with the 4-H Horse program.
