Just A Thought

By bringing an entry to the 4-H Fair, you are asking for a judge's opinion of your work. Although you may not always agree with the judge's decision, remember that you asked for an opinion. Youth are allowed to ask questions of the judge during the consultation time, and that may help make it easier to understand the comments that the judge gives.



Judging is not a final grade! It is not a reflection on the 4-H Member. A red ribbon animal or garment does not mean that the 4-H Member is a red ribbon person! It only means a little more work is needed . . . that's all!

Parents and project leaders can help a great deal by going through the judging process at home several times before the fair. This may relieve some of the anxieties of fair time. This will make fair time just another opportunity for an opinion.

Conference judging is an excellent opportunity for the 4-H Member to listen to the judge's comments about their product and for the 4-H Member to tell the judge about their product. This exchange should be between the 4-H Member and the judge.

As a parent, it is easy to answer the questions. Please let this be a learning experience for your child. Always speaking for your child only deprives them of the ability to think on their feet and present their own ideas.

County Fire Bans and Rocket Launches

This is a reminder about Kansas 4-H Rocketry rules as they relate to fire bans in Kansas. While some areas of Kansas have received good recent rains, the situation can change very rapidly. The 2025 Kansas State Fair rules State:



If a fire "burn ban" is in effect for any county in Kansas, exhibitors in any Kansas County are not required to launch their rocket(s). All requirements for the launching of rockets for the state fair and the documenting of the launching are suspended for the duration of the ban.

We advise all counties to be cautious and use good judgment in planning and conducting rocket launches, and consider cancelling them if dry conditions warrant.

Kansas 4-H/FFA Wheat Expo

The wheat expo will be a fun, educational and hands-on program for all Kansas 4-H members, siblings, parents, grandparents, and KSRE Extension staff. You do not have to be enrolled in crops/plant science projects to participate. 4-H members enrolled in Foods and Nutrition, Photography and Agronomy are encouraged to participate.

The Kansas 4-H State Wheat Expo is a wheat fun day showcasing all things wheat. Lunch and refreshments are sponsored, and tours will be available. **Registration is open** at https://www.kansas4-h.org/educational-experiences/project-based-events/conferences-events/wheat/ If you are planning on staying overnight don't delay in making your reservation once registration is open.

2026 Kansas 4-H Wheat Variety Plot Contest

The 2025-26 4-H Wheat Variety Plot program begins in the fall of 2025 with planting and wraps up in the fall of 2026 with the State 4-H Wheat Variety Plot displays at the Kansas State Fair. The 4-H Wheat Variety Plot program is open to all 4-H members enrolled in the 4-H Agronomy project who have an interest in studying how different wheat varieties perform in their part of the state. 4-H members are encouraged to work closely with their local agriculture agent and/or an adult mentor. The 4-H Wheat Varieties are meant to be a hands-on experience for youth.

Members who are interested should contact the Extension Office by July 15 for information. There will be no cost for the program.

Photography Themed Class & Items to Remember

We are pleased to announce the theme for the 2025 4-H Photography Competition is **Living** in **Paradise**. 4-H members can submit a photograph that illustrates what makes living here in our area or in Kansas great. Be sure and check out the specifics when the fair papers are available. You will need to choose the specific class number for Theme Photo Class when preentering for the county fair. This is a <u>county only</u> class and is not eligible for the Kansas State Fair.



- Photographic subject matter is expected to follow 4-H standards. For a sense of prohibited subject matter, review the Kansas 4-H member Code of Conduct; in general, if it is not allowable at a 4-H event, it is not allowable in a 4-H photograph at the State Fair.
- Photos with live subject(s) on railroad right of way or taken from railroad right of way property will not be displayed in Kansas 4-H Photography.
- Copyright protections must be observed.

Decisions as to display and/or penalties will be made by the Photography Superintendent and the Extension Staff.

- Are modifiable to reduce sugar or fat.

Ensure Your Frostings and Fillings Are Safe

The Frostings and Fillings Fact Sheet helps you determine if your frostings or fillings are safe to store at room temperature. (An added bonus, this calculation is what you must attach to your entry at the fair if you have frostings or fillings - so it's a win-win!) This fact sheet is an invaluable tool, ensuring the safety and quality of your culinary creations. We hope you find this resource helpful and enjoy exploring the world of frostings and fillings. Remember, there is a new rule put in place for safety with frostings and fillings for the 4-H Foods & Nutrition project. It states "For food safety purposes, any entries with frostings and fillings must calculate the amount of sugar in the frosting/filling recipe only. Calculation must be attached to entry, or the placing will be lowered one ribbon when judged. Frosting and fillings need to contain more than 65% sugar for safety." Livestock Premium Auction Policy Change



Attention Livestock Exhibitors: Due to recent policy changes at the state and local levels, livestock that have sold through the Ottawa County Fair and Tri-Rivers Fair Livestock Sales are now eligible to show at the Kansas State Fair and Kansas Junior Livestock Show, as long as they have not changed ownership. Please feel free to give the Extension Office a call if you have any questions.

Important Fair Update: No Perishable Entries Accepted

To ensure the health and safety of all fair participants and visitors, we will no longer be accepting *perishable* food items as fair entries. This change aligns with current food safety guidelines and helps us maintain a safe environment for all. We appreciate your understanding and encourage you to continue showcasing your talents with non-perishable food items and other creative entries!

Perishable foods are items that must be kept hot or cold — like dairy products, fresh meats, cream pies, or anything with fresh fruit or uncooked eggs. *Non-perishable foods* are shelf-stable and safe to display at room temperature—like cookies, breads, jams, canned goods, or dried foods.

Minimum Livestock Weights at County Fair

The minimum weights for livestock to be eligible for grand or reserve champion and be eligible to sell in the premium auction at the 2025 Ottawa County Fair and 2025 Tri-Rivers Fair are as follows:

Beef: 1,000 lbs Meat Goats: 50 lbs Sheep: 90 lbs Swine: 220 lbs

Fair Ribbons & Trophies

Do you have a great display idea for ribbons and trophies? Does your 4-H Member keep a scrapbook of ribbons? If so, we'd love to see pictures of how your family displays ribbons and trophies after the events. Please send pictures to klittich@ksu.edu to share your great ideas!

We've also heard from several families they'd like to see a "recycle" option for ribbons and/or trophies, so we are starting one! If your family would like to "recycle" ribbons or trophies, a collection box will be available. Ribbons should be unmarked and can be from any CKD 4-H event (shows, 4-H Club Day, fairs, etc.). Trophies can also be placed in the collection box as they can usually be repurposed by having a new plate made. These items may also be dropped off at either Extension Office to be added to the recycle program.



Saline County Small Livestock Pen Improvement Project

A group of stakeholders is working on raising funds to replace the small livestock animal pens in Barn 2 at the Saline County Expo Center. The stakeholder group includes the Saline County 4-H Development Fund, K-State Extension, Ell-Saline FFA, Salina FFA, SES FFA, Saline County Expo, Tri-River Fair Board, and community members. This group recognizes that the current pens are challenging to operate and have caused animal injuries at past fairs. The goal is to raise \$75,000 to replace all of the goat, sheep and swine pens and finish the showring before the 2026 Tri-Rivers Fair. Club Leadership

Change is good! Some clubs have a rotation system in place for volunteers to gradually, with training, move into the Organizational Leadership role. This process aids in recruiting volunteers to serve in leadership roles. Volunteers come in all shapes and sizes and ideas . . . some volunteers are more willing to serve if they know it isn't a forever commitment! Plus, the rotation system strengthens a club, as more volunteers know the club's system! The new 4-H year is approaching, will the leadership stay the same? Will it change? Please notify either Extension Office by September 1 of who the Organizational Leaders will be for the 2025-26 year! This is important for preparing promotional materials!

Club Elections

The following are suggested guidelines for conducting the 2025-26 club election of officers:

- Nominate and vote for the member who would carry out the responsibilities of the office well. **Election of officers should not be a popularity contest.**
- A nominating committee, made up of 4-H members and parents, should develop a slate of candidates, preferably two or more candidates per office.
- * Vote on each office individually. It takes extra time, but allows important learning time for members.
- **Club** members should be allowed the opportunity to nominate members from the floor for offices.
- A club needs to have a motion, a second and approval to close the nominations for each office.
- A nomination does not need to be a motion. It can simply be, 'I nominate Sally.'
- * Voting should be done by ballot. Ballots should be counted by two to three members who are not running for office and preferably not by members who made the nominations or by parents.
- **Each** member should have one vote per office.
- In cases where the club may have more than one person in office, each member should vote for corresponding candidates.
