OZ-SOME 4-H CAMP INFORMATION

Don't forget, 4-H Camp will be held June 13-16, at Rock Springs 4-H Center. Rookie Camp will be held in two sessions: June 13-14 and June 15-16. Don't forget that due to limited space, Rookie Camp registrations are on a first come, first serve basis. We encourage individuals to not wait until the last minute to register as spots are filling up fast.

How to Register: An email was sent out to all active 4-H members/families when registration opened. Be sure to check your email! To register, go to <u>http://www.centralkansas.k-state.edu/4-h/4-hcamp/index.html</u> At this website you will find a link for the registration, camp counselor application, and a Parents Q & A document is there as well. When you register your child(ren) for 4-H Camp, remember you will complete the registration information AND the medical information requested. If your child(ren) have meds, they will need to be checked in with the Ambassadors and volunteers at the time of loading the bus. It will then be given to the nurses when the buses get to camp. You will pay online by credit card. Registration is due May 10 at 11:59 p.m. Once registration is submitted, all cancellations will incur a \$25 cancellation fee until May 14. Following May 14, there will be no refunds if a camper has to cancel their camp registration. Also, please be aware that any financial changes to the account (scholarship refunds, etc.) will incur a \$5 fee for each request.

Camp Counselor Information: Just a reminder, counselor applications will be due **April 13**. Interviews will be scheduled in Minneapolis on April 19 and in Salina on April 16 and April 17. Interviews will be scheduled between 3:00 -5:30 p.m. If these dates and times don't work for you, contact Sarah (<u>semaass@k-state.edu</u>) to set up an appointment for an interview. <u>Camp Counselors will need to complete the 4-H Council Scholarship Application and meet the necessary requirements to be eligible for the 4-H Council Scholarship. <u>The scholarship application is due with the Camp Counselor Application</u>. If the scholarship application is approved, the counselors will not have to pay their registration fee. Please make sure you also begin the Volunteer Screening Process if you have not, or update for 2018 with a renewal.</u>

Scholarship Information: 4-H Members who register for 4-H Camp will need to complete the 4-H Council Scholarship Application and meet the necessary requirements to be eligible for the 4-H Council Scholarship. The scholarship application will include a paragraph on "Why I want to attend camp." Scholarship sponsors include: 4-H Council, Ottawa County 4-H Foundation, Salina Downtown Lions and Saline County 4-H Development Fund. The completed scholarship application will be due to either Extension Office by May 10, the camp registration deadline (remember, it requires an organizational leader signature and the 4-H'er signature). You will receive a scholarship code to put in to get credit for the scholarship. Please read the text carefully in CampDoc for this code as you register for camp. Cost for regular campers is \$223 or \$123 with the 4-H Council Scholarship. Rookie camper cost is \$108 or \$38 with the 4-H Council Scholarship.

Qualified for a Red Wheel Scholarship? If a 4-H member qualified for a red wheel scholarship, he/she can use this for 4-H Camp! The 4-H member will need to register online. Once he/she has registered, he/she will need to contact Dorothy Bray (<u>dbray@ksu.edu</u> or 309-5850) at the Salina Extension Office to let her know that he/she has registered for camp. Once the registration has been confirmed, a check will be

sent to the 4-H member/family. Please allow 7-10 business days for this to occur.

<u>Camp Theme</u>: This year's 4-H camp theme is *Pirates of the Camp-ibbean*. To add some fun to camp, if we increase our camp numbers by 10 campers this year, campers will see Sarah "walk the plank" into the cool pool during 4-H camp. We need 75 youth to register for camp to make this happen! Be sure to sign up for camp and invite your friends to attend too!



OZ-SOME 4-H CAMP INFORMATION-CONTINUED

Remember...all campers will ride the bus. Full-time campers will ride it to and from. First session rookie campers will ride it to camp and someone will need to pick them up. Second session rookie campers will need their own transportation to camp, and then they will ride the bus home.

If your child(ren) have meds, they will need to be checked in with the Ambassadors at the time of loading the bus. It will then be given to the nurses when the buses get to camp.

TAGGING & CHECK-IN FOR: MARKET MEAT GOAT & MARKET LAMB



The Districtwide tagging & check-in will be held April 25, in Salina (fairgrounds) and April 26, in Minneapolis (fairgrounds) from 4 to 6 p.m. for meat goats and lambs: Tags will cost \$3/tag. 4-H'ers will check-in their own swine projects through a separate process. If interested in exhibiting livestock at the State Fair or Junior Livestock Show, a nomination will be around \$8/animal (the 2018 cost has not yet been released).

LIVESTOCK DECLARATION FORM*



This form is required for all market animals for county fair, state fair, and the Kansas Junior Livestock Show. For the state fair and Kansas Junior Livestock Show, the due date for Market Beef – May 1; due date for Swine, Commercial Heifer, Sheep and Meat Goats – June 15. This year there will be two forms which will be found under 4-H'er Forms & Documents at <u>http://www.centralkansas.ksu.edu/4-H</u>. One form will be labeled as **<u>DISTRICT</u>** for the county fairs, and the other form will be labeled as **<u>STATE</u>** for KSF and KJLS.

KANSAS STATE FAIR & KANSAS JUNIOR LIVESTOCK SHOW INFORMATION

- DNA Hair Samples are required for each nominated animal for ALL SPECIES.
- There is a one-time/year \$20.00 fee if a nomination has to be returned to the family for any reason (i.e., incomplete form).
- <u>Wether Dam Ewes and Commercial Ewes</u> Nominations and declaration form* sealed DNA hair sample envelope and official 4-H ear tag number are due June 15 for KSF and KJLS.
- <u>Commercial Breeding Heifers</u> Nominations and declaration form* sealed DNA hair sample envelope and ear tag and legible tattoo are due June 15 for KSF and KJLS.
- <u>Steers and Market Heifers</u> Nominations and declaration form* sealed DNA hair sample envelope are due by May 1 for KSF and KJLS.
- <u>Market Lambs</u> Nominations and declaration form* sealed DNA hair sample envelope and scrapie tag number along with ear tag number are due by June 15 for KSF and KJLS.
- <u>Market Hogs and Commercial Gilts</u> Nominations and declaration form* sealed DNA hair sample envelopes are due by June 15 for KSF and KJLS with valid PQA#. All animals must be ear notched and it must be drawn on the form.
- <u>Meat Goats</u> Nominations, declaration form*, sealed DNA hair sample envelope, scrapie tag number, and ear tag by June 15 for the KSF and KJLS.

Nomination forms and DNA hair sample envelopes can be picked up at either Extension Office. Each nomination cost will be around \$8.00 (the 2018 cost has not yet been released) and makes the animal eligible for both the KSF and KJLS. **Remember, a nomination is not an entry for the show.**

4-H CAMPFERENCE – JUNE 26-29, 2018

4-H Campference is for youth ages 12-14 (before January 1, 2018), and will be held June 26-29, at Rock Springs 4-H Center. Participants will experience the feel of a conference, while enjoying the 'camp' activities Rock Springs 4-H Center has to offer. This is a great transitional opportunity, as these tweens go from being a camper to attending educational conferences. 4-H Campference will feature workshops about opportunities in the 4-H program and how to better interact with others. Participants will meet other youth from around the state of Kansas. Registration and detailed information will be coming soon! Plan to register early as the space will fill on a first

come basis, and Campference has been full the last four years

SEWING MACHINES FOR CHECKOUT FOR 4-H MEMBERS ONLY

The District has three sewing machines for 4-H members to check out (one in Minneapolis and two in Salina). The machines can be checked out for 7 days, or 1 week. Checkout will require a \$100 refundable deposit, with checks to be made out to CKD Extension. If the 4-H member wants to check out the ¼ inch foot, that will require an additional \$30 deposit. Individuals MUST allow for time to go through a check out sheet and check in sheet when checking out and returning the sewing machine. Note: The only sewing needles provided are the 80/12 needles.



If the 4-H member needs a special needle based on the material he/she will be working with, he/she will need to supply their own.

Discovery Days registration "Tell Your Story" is open now for youth 13 - 18 years of age (before January 1, 2018)! You can find the online registration at <u>www.kansas4-H.org</u> when you click on "4-H Event Registration." The deadline to register is April 16, 2018. Registration fees (checks made payable to CKD 4-H Council), scholarship application, and a copy of the registration confirmation are due no later than April 16, 5:00 p.m. to either Extension Office. In order to qualify for a scholarship through 4-H Council, individuals must complete the 4-H Council Scholarship Application and submit it at the same time as they pay their registration fees. The cost of Discovery Days is \$235 plus any additional class fees for non-4-H members. The cost for 4-H members is \$160 with an approved 4-H Council Scholarship Application, plus any additional class fees. There will be a \$10 fee to help cover the cost of transportation to Discovery Days. Registrations that are cancelled on or before April 16 will be charged a \$25 cancellation fee. The 4-H Council Scholarship WILL NOT cover this cancellation fee. Any cancellations made after May 1 will be charged the full amount. For 2018 – If you would like to be housed in a suite (2-4 people sharing a bathroom), you can upgrade your registration for \$40/person. Space is very limited and will be on a first come, first serve basis. Any and all requests for housing should be submitted when the delegate registers for Discovery Days.

Horse IDs

There is a NEW Horse ID Form that needs to be used for the 2017-18 4-H Year. A link to the new Horse ID Form can be found at <u>http://www.centralkansas.ksu.edu/4-H</u> under 4-H'er Forms and Documents, "Horse ID." Be sure and check the back page, lower right hand corner for the October, 2017 date to ensure you have the correct form.

Items to note:

- The form MUST BE front and back of one page, not 2 pages.
- A standard size picture MUST BE attached. The picture should include all 4 legs and feet showing a profile of the horse with the head turned toward the camera. ALL markings must be clearly visible.
- Members, Parent/Guardian, Owners (if horse is leased) and County Agents MUST sign and date.
- The ORIGINAL 4-H Horse Identification Certificate MUST accompany the 4-H'er. The county office and project leader may have a photocopy.
- This form can be signed anytime between now and May 1, 2018.

If you have any questions, please don't hesitate to contact the Extension Office.

Snaffle Bit Information

Horse snaffle bit projects are due into the local Extension Office by May 1. Along with the nomination, the 4-H member must submit the Horse ID and a \$10 fee. The nomination form, a copy of the horse ID (including a color picture of the horse) and fee will be sent to the State 4-H Office from the Salina/Minneapolis Office. Three-year old snaffle bit projects must have been nominated the previous year and did not have to be shown to be re-nominated. State Fair entries for these projects are due the end of July. For more information concerning the Snaffle bit project check the 4-H Horse Show Rule Book which can be found at http://www.centralkansas.ksu.edu/4-h under 4-H'er Forms and Documents.

ACCIDENT INSURANCE

American Income Life provides 4-H groups with an Annual Group Accident Policy for all of our 4-H events. Some of our 4-H clubs have provided this insurance through the club and on the District level take out the insurance for individual Districtwide events.

In the 2018 4-H Council Budget, the Finance and Fundraising Committee included a line item for 4-H Council to provide this accident insurance on a District level. This was approved by 4-H Council at the January meeting. What does this mean?

- All 4-H members are covered.
 - The volunteers who are covered under the District policy include:
 - Organizational Leaders (i.e., 4-H Club Leaders)
 - Districtwide Project Leaders (You must be on Sarah's Districtwide Project Leader list. If you indicated you want to serve as a Districtwide Project Leader through 4HOnline, but are not on Sarah's list, you will not be covered. Contact Sarah if you have any questions.)
 - Master 4-H Volunteers
- If your club currently has accident insurance through American Income Life, you can let your policy expire for the above mentioned individuals. However, you may want to continue the insurance for your club project leaders (who are not 4-H members, but adult volunteers) as they are not covered under the District accident insurance as highlighted above.
- The cost is \$1/member (or volunteer)/year. The exception to this is our horse project members and leaders, the cost for them is \$2/member (or volunteer)/year.

ATTENTION 4-H FAMILIES & ORGANIZATIONAL LEADERS: CENTRAL KANSAS DISTRICT FUNDRAISING POLICY

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The Central Kansas Extension Board adopted a policy to go alongside the Kansas 4-H Policy regarding fundraising at the February 2014 Board Meeting. The policy is:

"4-H members MAY NOT solicit funds to help fund their individual 4-H projects. 4-H members may fundraise for a specific 4-H EDUCATIONAL trip. Donations given directly to a 4-H member ARE NOT tax deductible because they do not go to a 4-H club or group. Any fundraising programs by clubs or individuals MUST be approved by the 4-H Youth Development Agent; the funds must be used to further the 4-H mission; the account procedures must be appropriate and in accordance with the POLICY; and the 4-H name and emblem must be properly used."

Any fundraising done in the name of 4-H needs to be approved by Sarah.

FAMILY AND CONSUMER SCIENCES JUDGING CONTEST UPDATE

For this year's Kansas State Fair, there are several updates to the FCS Judging Contest. In order to qualify for the FCS Judging at the State Fair, youth will be forming teams and submitting a video. 4-H ages 9-13 will be eligible to participate in the Intermediate division and youth 4-H ages 14-19 will be eligible for the Senior division. Participants may only register as a team. Individual entries will not be permitted to enter this contest. Each team must have at least 2 members, and no more than 4 members. Eligible teams must submit a FCS Judging video and other supporting documents. Submissions will be due May 15. Submissions will be evaluated and teams will be notified if they have been chosen to represent the Central Kansas District at the Kansas State Fair. This year's contest theme will be Health. For more information and details about entering the contest, there is an informational video and more information that will soon be posted under "What's Hot" on the Central Kansas District 4-H website (<u>http://www.centralkansas.ksu.edu/4-H</u>). Be sure to start finding your team members now!
